#### **CHIEF'S CORNER**

Hardening Your Home: Flying embers destroy homes up to a mile from wildland areas. Prepare (harden) your home now before fire starts.

Roof: The roof is the most vulnerable part of your home. Homes with wood or shingle roofs are at high risk of being destroyed during a wildfire. Build your roof or re-roof with materials such as composition, metal or tile. Block any spaces between roof decking and covering to prevent embers from catching.

**Vents:** Vents on homes create openings for flying embers. Cover all vent openings with 1/8-inch to 1/4-inch metal mesh. Do not use fiberglass or plastic mesh because they can melt and burn. Protect vents in caves or cornices with baffles to block embers. (Mesh is not enough.)

Eaves and Soffits: Eaves and soffits should be protected with ignition-resistant or non-combustible materials.

Windows: Heat from a wildfire can cause windows to break even before the home ignites. This allows burning embers to enter and start fires inside. Single-paned and large windows are particularly vulnerable. Install dual-paned windows with one pane of tempered glass to reduce the chance of breakage in a fire. Consider limiting the size and number of windows that face large areas of vegetation.

Walls: Wood products, such as boards, panels or shingles, are common siding materials. However, they are combustible and not good choices for fire-prone areas. Build or remodel your walls with ignition resistant building materials, such as stucco, fiber cement, wall siding, fire retardant treated wood, or other approved materials. Be sure to extend materials from the foundation to the roof.

**Decks:** Surfaces within 10 feet of the building should be built with ignition-resistant, non-combustible, or other approved materials. Ensure that all combustible items are removed from underneath your deck.

**Rain Gutters:** Screen or enclose rain gutters to prevent accumulation of plant debris.

**Patio Cover:** Use the same ignition resistance materials for patio coverings as a roof.

Chimney: Cover your chimney and stovepipe outlets with a non-combustible screen. Use metal screen material with openings no smaller than 3/8 inch and no larger than 1/2 inch to prevent embers from escaping and igniting a fire.

Garage: Have a fire extinguisher and tools such as a shovel, rake, bucket, and hoe available for fire emergencies. Install weather stripping around and under the garage door to prevent embers from blowing in. Store all combustible and flammable liquids away from ignition sources.

# Address: Make sure your address is clearly visible from the road!

Driveways and Access Roads: Driveways should be built and maintained in accordance with state and local codes to allow fire and emergency vehicles to reach your home. Consider maintaining access roads with a minimum of 10 feet of clearance on either side, allowing for two way traffic. Ensure that all gates open inward and are wide enough to accommodate emergency equipment. Trim trees and shrubs overhanging the road to allow emergency vehicles to pass.

Our maintenance men, Jonathan and Kevin, have been busy trying to keep up with the mowing and weed eating to keep the common areas looking good. As time and weather permit they have also been doing some pot hole patching and other road maintenance projects.

A road bid package was sent by the Board out to contractors for proposed road work this year and we had two contractors show up to review the proposed project. We confirmed measurements and best procedure suggested for each area of the proposed

roads. We also reviewed applying a fog seal to the runway. May 30<sup>th</sup> the Board will meet to review the bids and determine what work can be done. Any work approved will again be completed by the end of July.

#### FINNON LAKE NEWS

The lake is at its highest level in almost 15 years, and water clarity has improved over the last two months. Small bass can be seen cruising the shoreline along the dam face, indicating a successful spawning by the native bass last spring. Fish stocking permits have been approved by California Fish & Wildlife. Initially we will stock forage fish such as bluegill and mosquitofish and also crawdads. These bait species will insure a good food supply for the native fish and for the future bass we plan to introduce to the lake.

After their de-chlorination structure has been completed, EID will be delivering a significant quantity of water to our lake. This past winter volunteers constructed 85 bass spawning beds out of rocks and gravel. We are hoping that the additional water from EID will cover those beds.

The lake is still closed to all fishing. January 2014 is our tentative target to reopen fishing. The lake will be designated as a "catch and release" fishery, which was a condition of receiving the grant money for the Finnon Lake Restoration Project. No bait will be allowed, only artificial lures and flies. Barbless hooks are recommended but not required. A further condition of the grant is the installation of a boat cleaning station. All boaters will be asked to clean their craft prior to launching to prevent introducing invasive species (such as zebra mussels and quagga mussels) to our lake. No

gasoline powered motors will be permitted. We envision Finnon Lake becoming a premier fishing destination for catching large bass and bluegill. As such, it will boost our local economy by increasing business at the campground and restaurant.
