### CHIEF'S CORNER

Greetings all! Have you noticed the new window blinds at the fire station? A big thank you goes out to the crafters for purchasing the blinds. And a big thank you to Ralph and Sharon Hern for taking the time to install the blinds.

Next I would like to congratulate four of our Volunteer Fire Fighters: Sam McClung, Kathy Ponting, Todd Spivey, and Crosby Markgraf who just completed the El Dorado County Fire Academy. The Fire Academy started in January with training on Wednesday nights and weekends and the class was graduated at a ceremony on June 1st. The addition of these new grads strengthens our fire fighting team in protecting our community.

This has been a strange summer so far. It seems that one-week the temperature will be in the 100's and the next it is down in the low 80's. We just need to stay prepared for whatever the weather brings and have plenty of water on hand to prevent dehydration.

I have been asked about the Fire-Safe wood chipping program hosted by the El Dorado County Fire-Safe Program. To date the chipping program is in effect until August, so get your orders in now. Contact number is 530- 647-1700 or find the El Dorado Fire Safe Council website. On their site, click on the chipping program and fill out the order form.

ALL BURNING SUSPENDED AS OF JUNE 17<sup>th</sup> On Saturday July 20<sup>th</sup>, from 9:00 till 1:00 we are having an Evacuation Drill at the Swansboro Airport. There will be information on what to do in the event you have to evacuate your home: where to go, what to bring, what to do with your animals and the next step if you were to lose your home. We will serve lunch and drinks and you can meet the Fire Department Support Group. As you drive around the district you can see evacuation signs showing the way out of the district down to the airport. If and when we have a big event, the Swansboro Airport is a safe zone in our district. With fire fighting equipment coming up Rock Creek Road, it would be too dangerous to drive.

El Dorado County Animal Control and an Incident coordinator from EARS (the Emergency Animal Rescue Service) will also be present. This is an all volunteer organization which has the ability to come into an area during a severe emergency and collect, monitor, help, and house animals. They help large animals as well as cats and dogs. They have volunteers who bring trailers, cages, corrals, supplies, and feed into an area so that all the needs of all animals can be met. This is a very worthwhile group that will be here if ever they are needed. The fire department will coordinate all rescue activities with them and animal control if there is a fire. Hopefully, we will not need their services, but it is great knowing they are there.

The plan, if it becomes necessary to implement, is to evacuate everyone to the airport. It is safer to evacuate those who are living here to a safe place locally. The American Red Cross plans have been put in place where people can be evacuated to safe areas such as the hangers at the Swansboro Airport. Many of those who own the hangers have offered to allow them to be utilized for safe housing areas if the need should arise. If an evacuation becomes necessary everyone will be asked to go to the hangers where The Pilots Association and Fire Department Support Group will

provide initial assistance. Within minutes representatives from the American Red Cross will be notified. They would assess the needs of the comunity and start bringing in food, water, and shelter items as needed. An event this size would not happen without the volunteers from The Pilots Association, MVFA Support Group and the Fire Department.

# A BIG THANK YOU TO THE PILOT'S ASSOCIATION AND FIRE DEPARTMENT SUPPORT GROUP!

Hopefully we will be fortunate enough to have these plans in place but never have to use them. There is still a great deal of summer with hot and dry days to come so please be careful with all outdoor activities.

Now that burn permits have been suspended, Kevin and Jonathan have spent many hours reducing the volume of weeds and grass in the common areas. This work reduces fire hazard as well as improves the appearance of our community. Other projects include tree and brush removal at Bass Lake and continued work patching and ditching roadways.

We have awarded this year's roadwork to Doug Veercamp and they will begin work on Swansboro Road, Dickenson, Lupin, White Oak, and Stope Drive in mid July.

Veercamp has agreed to put in asphalt driveways to any resident at a reduced cost since their equipment will already be onsite. If you want to take advantage of this opportunity, please call Veercamp offices at 626 0825.

Open discussion at our recent meeting included how to cover volunteers working in common areas under workman's comp. Our insurance refuses to allow volunteers to work in these areas even to help clear brush and dead trees to reduce fire hazard. It seems hard to imagine that an insurance company would prohibit residents from reducing an obvious fire hazard, but it seems they do. We have agreed to look for a more reasonable insurance carrier when this contract expires.

We have contracted with Transworld Systems to help us collect from members who do not pay their Property Owners Dues. This agency will concentrate effort on our collections and allow our secretary Lynda to spend her time in other areas to benefit our community.

Volunteers are needed to serve on the SCPOA board next year. There are three terms that expire and these vacancies must be filled. If you have interest in helping guide our community toward continued progress, please consider being nominated. # Some Thoughts from the Editor by Candy Lupient

The circulation numbers for the Mosquito Byte have been decreasing in recent months as people have been moving out of the area and not renewing. If you know people "on the hill" who are not receiving The Byte, perhaps you would ask if they would be interested in subscribing. You might even consider making a subscription a Welcome to the Neighborhood gift for new neighbors. The \$15.00 annual subscription fee covers the cost of 1st class postage and printing.

As you probably know, The El Dorado County Department of Transportation is reviewing options for replacing the Mosquito Bridge. In recent inspections, CalTrans has found the bridge to be unsafe and it is no longer cost effective to maintain. Like many neighbors, I've noticed traffic on Mosquito Road has become not only more abundant, but also much faster. To me it seems just a matter of time before two of the overly aggressive drivers meet each other from opposing directions with tragic results. Please slow down and drive defensively. As so many people are moving on and off the hill, I will periodically run an article concerning Mosquito Road Etiquette. It would be helpful if you would share these rules of the road with expected guests and new neighbors. Many problems could be avoided simply with increased awareness. Here are a few suggestions and I welcome other suggestions from you!

- 1. Drive on the right side of the road. ALWAYS ASSUME there is oncoming traffic.
- 2. Yield to UPHILL traffic; they have the right of way.
- 3. Dim your headlights.

- 4. Keep a good distance from the car ahead of you. They may need to stop suddenly for wildlife.
- 5. Drive at a speed safe for conditions.
- 6. If you have an aggressive driver behind you, find a safe place to pull over and let them pass. When re-entering the road, beware of sharp road edges which can cause punctured tire sidewalls. If you are the one wanting to pass, give the car ahead of you time and space to pull over in a safe spot. Allow yourself adequate time to reach your destination. Drivers will not always pull over for you. I believe they are usually newcomers and simply not aware.
- 7. Remember, only one car at a time on the bridge. Always look to see if there is already a car on the bridge or a car waiting on the other side. Take turns! Neither direction has the right of way. If no one is waiting, allow the car ahead of you to exit the bridge before you enter.
- 8. Going toward town, if there is already traffic on or waiting for the bridge, pull all the way down to the guardrail nearest the bridge entrance, leaving room for exiting traffic. If you stop at the top of the hill it makes it difficult for the car going up the hill to pass.
- 9. Smile and wave; I believe it actually promotes more courteous drivers. It's a "Mosquito Thing!"
