CHIEF'S CORNER

Greetings all! Our district had been quiet so far this fire season. On July 8th we were on dispatch for the HWY 50 fire in Kyburz. Our Engine-275 with a crew of four reported at the scene around 7:00 pm and worked through the night holding an active fire line. They were released from the fire around 11:00 the next morning.

A week later, on Saturday morning about 8:30, I was at the station when someone walked in and reported a tree down that was blocking Mosquito Road. I went up to check on the size of the tree before I called DOT. On my way back to the station the department was dispatched for a wildland fire at Swansboro Road & Claim Street. I was just coming around the corner at Dyer Lake and noticed a column of black smoke. I confirmed to dispatch that I had visual on a column of black smoke. Once I arrived on the scene, I noticed an area in front of the house and garage which was fully engulfed with trailers, a camper, a boat and several out buildings. I immediately went to the house and banged on the door. There was no answer except for the dogs barking inside. I went to the back of the structures and saw fire next to the garage, working its way around the back side of the horse corral to the north. There were two horses in the corral running around but not in danger because the corral was large. I started back towards the front of the home and noticed fire working its way up the outside wall of the garage. About the time I reached the front of the house, something inside of the camper exploded which sent a fire ball up 30 feet into the trees. At this point I notified dispatch that I had a growing fire in the trees and requested two helicopters, 4 Cal-Fire engines, and 4 water tenders. Captain Todd Hern arrived on the scene and went to the north side of the property to see what the fire was doing. Engine 275 arrived, and staged in the driveway, with Captain Leo Chaloux and firefighters Mary Joseph, Todd Spivey and Wayne Holley. I had a hose

pulled to the left flank to protect the garage and another line to pick up the right flank. Next in was Tender 75 with Captain Tom Stuart who went to the north side near Captain Todd Hern and supported behind the garage and the left flank. Engine 75 arrived with Captain Jarred Infante and tied in to engine 75 to supply water. Engine 25 from Placerville arrived and they tied into Engine 75 for water supply. I had the crew from Engine 25 make entry into the garage to check for fire extension inside. Two Cal-Fire Engines arrived and had their crew support the hand line crews on the left and right flanks. About this time I thought we had a good handle on the fire with a wet line around 80% of the fire. I canceled the aircraft, 2 Cal-Fire engines and 3 of the water tenders. Tender 51 from Garden Valley arrived and I had them support Engine 275 with water.

The fire was contained with about 2 hours more of mop up (going around putting out hot spots) and everyone was released and went back to the station.

THANK YOU FIRE FIGHTERS AND THE SUPPORT GROUP WORKING TOGETHER TO KEEP OUR COMMUNITY SAFE!

Our biggest threat to the interruption of our lives is a wildland fire. We must be prepared if it should happen. Please remove the ground fuels around your house. Make your driveways wide enough so you can get out and we can safely get in. Plan ahead with your family about what should be done if it does happen. Please take responsibility.

Jonathan and Kevin continue to prep for the upcoming road work scheduled for the end of July. This will continue to be the priority with other maintenance done as time allows. Once the roads are done, work will continue on Bass Lake, road patching, and other projects.

We have had some members request to volunteer to do some clearing work in a common area, right now our workman's comp insurance is not allowing this. We will be exploring options both with our current carrier as well as others to see if we can find a way to allow this to be done.

A discussion was held about the possibility of increasing funding for our roads by getting homeowners who live outside the association to help pay for them. Quite a few people live in the community but outside the association. They must use the roads we maintain but do not contribute to the cost. This will be looked into to see if any options exist.

We held a brief budget meeting after our regular meeting to do a first quarter review of our budget. We need to make a few adjustments in areas that it's obvious we will exceed our budgeted amount but overall we're in good shape. We have far more areas that are well under budget than over. We received and reviewed our year end financial report and our CPA is very impressed with our financial health. We have a reasonably funded reserve account and have consistently stayed well within our budget while continuing maintenance. A large percentage of homeowners associations are not in good shape. They've had to raise dues each year and do not have adequate reserves.

First off, what's the Phone Tree, you ask? Well it's one of the ways that we get the word out when there's an event that warrants wide spread notification to our residents. These "events" are generally emergency in nature; a wild land fire, a road closure or a pending evacuation, but it could also be simply letting the community know about a special meeting which would be of general interest to our residents. Some examples of these types of meetings (events) would be the updates given by DOT when our bridge was closed, a "Town Hall" meeting held by our District 4 Supervisor or the meetings held by the Forest Service to let us know about pending operations or activities in the National Forest.

Who are the Phone Tree callers? They are a group of community members who have volunteered to make these calls when the Phone Tree is activated by either the Fire Department or the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association. And.... we could use your help because we need a few more volunteer callers. If you are interested in becoming a Phone Tree caller give me a call at 295-9165.

Will I be called if the Phone Tree is activated? If you are listed in the new 2013 Mosquito Phone Book or have recently added your name to the phone book, you will be called. If you're not in the Phone Book but would still like to be on the Phone Tree call list give me a call and I will see that you are added to the list. Our Phone Tree lists are <u>not public</u> and are only accessed by our callers, so your privacy will not be compromised by being placed on the Phone Tree call list.

Station Manager - Oversees Support Group operations when there is an incident.

Communications - Handles public inquiries and assists the station Manager.

Traffic Control - Directs traffic around an incident to keep firefighters and the public safe.

Pump Operations - Provides water to Engines and Tankers from our many lakes in the area.

Transportation - Delivers late arriving volunteers, equipment, food and water to the incident.

Hydrant Management - Provides water to fire equipment from fire hydrants in the District.

Evacuation Assistance - Assists elderly or disabled community members that may need a little help during an emergency evacuation.

Nourishment - Prepares food snacks, water, coffee and Gatorade for the firefighters who are at an incident.

Child Care - Supervises firefighter's children at the station while the volunteer is fighting a fire.

As you can see, there are a lot of "behind the scenes" jobs to fill and not nearly enough volunteers from the community to fill them. Some of us are not as young as we were when we became involved in the Support Group and we could sure use your help! Please consider contacting Chief Davis or any Fire Department staff member to learn more about becoming a Support Group volunteer.

For me, well, I'll continue to do this job with pride as long as I can in order to help my community and my neighbors.
