DON'T BE THE CAUSE OF A FIRE

YOU DON'T HAVE TO HAVE A MATCH TO START A FIRE!

Every year, people trying to eliminate their fire hazards by mowing, start fires instead. Hot, dry, and windy weather are perfect conditions for a fire. Here's how to keep cool, eliminate the fire hazard and prevent a fire:

Mow before 10:00 AM and after 7:00 PM only if it's not too hot to mow. REMEMBER DON'T MOW DURING THE HEAT OF THE DAY!

Keep the exhaust system, spark arrester and mower in proper working order and free of carbon buildup. Use the recommended grade of fuel and don't top off.

Avoid striking rocks with metal blades. A grass-hidden rock is enough to start a fire.

Keep the engine and cooling fins free of oil and dust. It reduces the chance the mower will catch fire and it will let the mower run cooler and last longer.

Keep the mower free of flammable materials. Check the grass outlet, around the blade, and the grass bag for obstructions.

Spark arresters are required on all portable gasoline equipment. (TRACTORS, CHAIN SAWS, MOWERS)

Grinding and welding operations require 10 feet of clearance and a fire extinguisher.

Keep a shovel and fire extinguisher handy. CALL 911, in case of a fire.

Wine Barrel Bar at Rock Creek Café

Have you been to Rock Creek Cafe lately? If so, I hope you noticed a new bar table in the garden patio, beautifully created by our own on-the-hill wood working artist, Dave Angelo!!!

"It takes a village" to make something beautiful come to fruition and it is amazing what a fabulous village we live in. :-)

Yours truly had a concept of creating a bar table out of wine barrels for the garden section at Rock Creek Cafe and approached Dave Angelo with the idea. He immediately started working on the technical aspect of how to best construct it for beauty and longevity. He enthusiastically and successfully got other people involved. This can truly be classified as a community project! Although I was gone a lot for work in the Bay Area, Dave kept me posted with the progress along the way. This is my understanding of the chain of events that took place, which lead to the lovely bar table:

Several years ago Fire Chief Bob Davis, was out in the National Forest cutting up a large Cedar tree that had died somewhere between Wentworth Springs and Mosquito Village. He gave the logs to Tom Harris, who milled it into planks on John and Allison Moalli's sawmill. Tom then let it air dry for two years, before

donating the two planks to this project. Dave Angelo took the planks and planed them to desired thickness with the help of Lou Bacigalup, so they could be dowelled and glued together to form the bar's top. Next, the top had to be cut on both ends so that the radii would match the radii of the two wine barrels. Not an easy task! The barrels and top were sanded and then varnished by Pam Angelo. She used 5 coats of UV marine varnish for protection from the sun and possible rain. The bar unit was then assembled using 6 "L" brackets. When it came time to transport the unit to Rock Creek Cafe, it was disassembled again so the barrels and top could be brought over safely to the café, without being damaged. The precious cargo was delivered in a newly acquired luxury truck, owned and operated by Al and Gail Herron. The wine barrels originally came from somewhere in France, but were purchased through a broker in Elk Grove. Milo Laguna offered to use his big truck and trailer to pick them up (I bought quite a few of them in case we want to have more planters and bar tables around) with the help from Mark Cozy.

So, in the end, it's a table that has had many loving hands touch it along the way. My hope is that it will be treasured and used by many of us during our dining occasions at Rock Creek Cafe. We're also looking for a few barstools to go with the new bar table. If you, or someone you know, can donate or create suitable bar stools, please let me know by emailing li@california-gardens.com
