MFPD UPDATE

As many of you probably know by now, Chief Tom Stuart resigned his post last month. The MFPD Board of Directors would like to thank Tom for his service and hard work. Tom stepped up and filled the Chief position in a time of need, and was diligent in his pursuit of training, safety and readiness for the department.

When Tom resigned, Chris Johns took the initiative to make sure that a command structure remained in place, and thanks to his efforts, there was no gap in command coverage on the hill. The Board has appointed Chris to the position of Battalion Chief of Operations, and Chris will remain in this position through the fire season. Chris and his team of firefighters responded to a wild land fire in the lower part of the district on Sunday, May 18, and quickly brought the situation under control. If you have the chance, please join the board in thanking Chris for taking charge in his new leadership position.

At our scheduled meeting earlier this month, the Board had an agenda item to discuss the possibility of a functional consolidation with the Georgetown and Garden Valley fire districts. The concept of a functional consolidation is to maintain the identity of our district, while sharing some services with other districts. For example, if Mosquito was able to share **administrative** work with Georgetown, our firefighter secretary could devote more time to firefighting. The goal of the board is to increase the level of coverage (and lower response times) in our district while keeping costs as low as possible. While it has been suggested that a functional consolidation would mean that service to our community would only be provided from Georgetown or Garden Valley, with commensurate high response times, **this is absolutely not the case.**

Over the next few weeks, MFPD will be hiring an additional firefighter, bringing the number of full time

employees in the district up to four. The funding for this position will be coming from patch monies allocated by the county as part of an effort to change the funding mechanisms for all fire districts, and especially rural districts like ours, throughout El Dorado County. We are pleased that this new position will enable us to increase coverage in Mosquito.

If you are interested in learning more about how the district operates, feel free to come to a Board of Directors meeting on the second Thursday of the month at 7:00 pm in the station. For those of you who wish to learn more about volunteering, contact Chief Johns or come to the volunteer training at 7:00 pm on Tuesday evenings.

SCPOA

Our maintenance crew has been busy mowing and cutting weeds to keep up with the rapid growth. New cement pads were also poured in front of the bathrooms at Dyer Lake in order to keep dirt out. A new load of sand will be ordered and spread at Dyer to make the beach more usable for summer.

We still have owners who have not paid their assessments for this year; pre lien letters have been sent and small claims court actions will begin soon. If you need to make a payment, please contact out secretary, Lynda, at 621-0309 to make arrangements and avoid the extra costs.

One of our newer board members, Connell, is working on a survey to be included in the June packet. This will help the board determine what is most important to members and we will be able to look at the items in our DC&R's that need to be changed. **We hope that members will take the time to fill out and return this survey in order to help the board improve our community!**

The board is looking at providing sick leave for our three employees; a guideline was drawn up that would allow for one week each year with a maximum accumulation of two weeks. This would be cost neutral if only one week each year is used since employee pay is based on 52 weeks and have pretty minimal cost if more needs to be used. The board also approved continuing services with our current CPA, Tom Balarsky. We agreed to change insurance companies for insuring our airport. This change in airport insurance will save us almost 50% and provide better coverage.

Our next meeting will be Thursday June 19th starting at 6:00 PM at the fire station.

MVFA has an opportunity to have the parking lot of the Mosquito General Store and Deli Cafe paved with chip & seal in conjunction with the work being done on the dam road. The grant money used to install the bridge and pave the road to the dam cannot be used for the parking lot. MVFA has a budget item for this work for future completion, but wants it completed now, while the contractor's equipment is here. The MVFA budget of \$11,307 however, is \$5,982 short of the bid proposed by the contractor. The Board has decided to borrow this amount in order to take advantage of this proposal.

We are asking for donations from the community to make up the borrowed amount of \$5,982. As you know, MVFA is totally self-supportive. We receive no taxpayer funds, nor any funds from SCPOA. We rely on donations, fund-raiser events and fees from Fannon Recreation Area, and the Board agrees that this proposal will be a benefit to the community.

Finnon Dam Restoration Project

By the time you read this, the dam spillway bridge will have been installed, and the road across the dam will have been connected to it. In addition, the concrete anchor of the dam valve gate mechanism will be reinforced, and the slide gate will be operational. This is according to the contractor!

Many thanks go out to the Dam Steering Committee members led by Ralph Hern, and to the many volunteers who gave their time and expertise to overcome the numerous obstacles that were encountered in the Finnon dam replacement project. Moving fish when the lake was drained, surveying and clearing the entire lakeshore of vegetation below the high-water line, spreading straw that controlled erosion on the entire dam face, and diving on the gate valve for inspection and cleaning are just a few. Make no mistake about it, this project would not have been possible without your help.

Only one more task remains ahead of us, and that is the installation of the guard rails across the dam. The guard rail system will be delivered in pre-drilled, pre-fitted kit form. The post holes will be dug by a professional contractor. At that time, the Dam

Committee will need volunteers to install the posts and connect the rail system on both sides of the road using the hardware supplied in the kits. Many hands make light work. Finnon Lake Update

The Finnion Lake Recreation Area opened May 23rd for fishing and camping!

There are two assigned day-use parking lots in the park. Campground parking is for overnight campers only. Please do not use the cafe parking lot for day-use activities. Only highway licensed vehicles are allowed in the park - No dirt bikes or ATVs.

A \$6 day-use fee will be requested at the main entrance to the park for activities like fishing, boating, picnicking and disc golf. Pay at the kiosk or at the cafe. There is no fee for hikers, bicyclists or maintenance workers. Due to restrictions of our insurance policy, horseback riding is not allowed on the Finnion property. An annual day-use pass for residents is in planning stages.

All watercraft should be washed at our boat cleaning facility located just past the recycling bins behind the restaurant. No gasoline powered boats are allowed on the lake, but electric motors are allowed.

Please remember that all the expenses of running the park - \$6,000 annual dam inspection fee, plus insurance costs, property taxes and maintenance costs - are paid by your fees, private donations and MVFA fundraisers - exclusively. The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association Board of Directors manages the park.

The opening date for fishing on Finnon Lake was May 23rd. Fishing regulations are the following:

1. Fishing License Required: Anglers aged 16 and older **MUST** have a valid California fishing license in their possession.
2. Catch regulations: This lake is **CATCH AND RELEASE** only. Please release fish gently. Avoid handling as much as possible and try not to touch the gill area.
3. Fishing Gear Regulations: Only one (1) rod or fishing line per angler. **NO BAIT-** artificial lures or flies **ONLY**. Barbless hooks are encouraged (pinch barb(s) with pliers to close the barb).
