You might have noticed some new faces around the Station lately. That's because we received funding from El Dorado County to add one additional firefighter and a part-time Firefighter / Apparatus, and Mechanic position to our staff. If you're in the vicinity of the Station, stop by and meet Firefighter Todd Spivey and Firefighter/Mechanic Wade Martini. (While you are there you can say Hi to Chris, Mary and Crosby too.)

Speaking of our staff, you may want to know what they and our outstanding volunteers have been doing this summer. Well, in the last two months we have responded to 4 medical aids, 2 public assists, 1 serpent removal, 3 vehicle accidents and 2 smoke checks.

Notice anything missing from that call list? That's right, there are no FIRES! Thus far YOU have been awesome in your diligence in preventing fires in our community. KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK BECAUSE WE AREN'T OUT OF THE WOODS YET!

The hot, dry months of August and September are still to come so here are a few things for you to keep in mind:

1. The hot, dry, and windy weather that we have been experiencing are perfect conditions for a fire originating from a spark from a mower blade striking a rock or other object. **Don't mow during the heat of the day!** Mow before 10:00 AM or after 7:00 PM.

2. When you do mow, keep the mower's exhaust system and spark arrester in proper working order and free of carbon buildup. Use the recommended grade of fuel and don't top off.
3. Before mowing check the area for rocks and other debris. Humans (you, kids or neighbors) as well as dogs or deer could accidentally kick a rock into an area that you thought was free of debris when you mowed there before.
4. Remember that spark arresters are required on all portable, gasoline equipment. (Tractors, chain saws, & mowers are all included in this requirement!)
5. And lastly, keep a shovel and water hose at the ready.

Be diligent and stay safe!

We have started the first round of small claims court actions against those who are furthest behind and have not made an effort to arrange payments. If you have not paid, please contact our secretary, Lynda Lima, at 621-0309 to make arrangements and avoid the extra costs of small claims court.

We have had a couple of complaints about properties with illegal structures. The complaints are being turned over to the El Dorado County Building Department and Code Enforcement. The SCPOA Board of Directors will try to work with the property owner when possible.

The association owns a property on Nuggett Court. We thought we had negotiated a deal to sell it, but so far that sale has not gone through. The board will again list this property for \$19,000. If anyone is interested, please contact Lynda Lima at 621-0309.

A Special Request and Thank You by the MVFA Board of Directors

In May, the MVFA Board asked for donations to help pay for the cost of paving the parking lot of the Mosquito General Store and Deli Cafe. Of the total cost of \$17,089 to pave the parking lot, the **Firehouse Crafters** organization donated \$1,500 for the project as a benefit to the community. Because MVFA is totally self-supportive, we must rely on donations, fund-raiser events and fees from Finnon Lake Recreation Area. MVFA receives no taxpayer funds, nor any funds from SCPOA, and all of the money we raise for Finnon Lake is used to improve the site. We sincerely thank the Firehouse Crafters for their generous donation.

As you know, the grant money used to install the bridge and pave the road to the dam could not be used for the parking lot. With a deficit of \$5,982 remaining, MVFA decided to borrow this amount and do the work while the contractor's equipment was here for the dam road, saving us a significant amount. Now, our goal is to raise \$5,982 to pay back the money we borrowed. We are very pleased to announce that we have so far received \$1,810 in donations for this purpose, and are thankful to all who donated so far.


