CHIEF'S CORNER

The Mosquito Fire Department is looking for new members!

Are you intrigued by the idea of working long hours under dangerous, uncomfortable and often filthy conditions, wearing unfashionable and cumbersome clothing, being dragged away from friends and family with no notice, all for absolutely no financial compensation? If so, then you may be a perfect candidate to become a **Mosquito Fire Department Volunteer Firefighter**. We are always looking for new talent to join the department and reap the substantial benefits of helping friends and neighbors when their need is greatest. The most important attribute of the successful volunteer firefighter is the willingness and ability to make the substantial commitment of time and energy that is necessary to do the job. **Come to the Fire Station and check us out!**

SO, WHAT HAVE WE BEEN DOING?

It's been a busy month for your Fire Department. Since our last Byte article we have handled 8 Medical calls, 7 Public Assists, 1 Traffic Incident and 3 Fire responses. I would like to specifically mention three of these calls and compliment Battalion Chief Chris Johns and our firefighters for their exemplarily performance.

The first. We were dispatched to a medical call where a patient had fallen and received a "gash on the forehead." Our firefighters quickly arrived at the scene and began treating the patient. BUT, they didn't just concentrate on the head wound. Following their training protocols, they "assumed" that there might also injury to the neck and spine and stabilized the head and neck before permitting the patient to be moved. Further examination at the hospital revealed that, in addition to the head wound, the patient also had a broken bone in her neck. **GOOD JOB FIREFIGHTERS!** Your care and diligence no doubt save this patient further much more serious injury.

The second. We were dispatched to a "plane down" in our district with two people on board. Our fire personnel were on the scene in a matter of minutes and once again their training and skills kicked in. Under BC Johns' direction, firefighters immediately began treating one patient who was outside the plane while other firefighters began treatment and extrication procedures for the person who was trapped inside the plane. The patient in the plane was pronounced dead at the scene and the injured patient who was outside the plane was transported in serious condition to an area hospital by Cal Star. **GOOD JOB FIREFIGHTERS!** Your training, skills and professionalism were evident in handling this emotionally traumatic incident.

The third. Our Water Tender 75 was dispatched as mutual aid to the "Sand Fire." Upon arrival at the staging area, they were immediately assigned to transport water from a distant point to the fire front. The skills and professionalism of the two volunteers assigned to the Tender must have been evident since the command staff at the fire kept Water Tender 75 in service for nearly 24 hours. (Our Volunteers took cat naps when time allowed.) Many of the other water transport vehicles were given rotational time off. **GOOD JOB FIREFIGHTERS!** The skills, ability and professionalism displayed in the presence of hundreds of firefighters from outside the district is not only a credit to you, but also a credit to the entire Department.

One last comment. Did you notice a group of men and women in yellow shirts at the pond at Maidu and Log Cabin a few Saturdays ago? Those were our Support Group volunteers. And just in case you were wondering, that big "thing" being towed by Utility 75 was our mobile pump which is used to provide water from our lakes and ponds to our fire engines and water tenders during a fire incident. Those yellow shirts are the volunteers who operate the pump. They are also the people you see controlling traffic at an emergency scene, delivering food and water to our firefighters in the field, and doing lots of other things to "support" our firefighters at an emergency. **GOOD JOB SUPPORT GROUP!** You are often behind the scenes but without you our Department would not function as efficiently as it does!

As you see, there is a lot of room for volunteers in our District. And it's a great way to help out the community in an emergency. So if you would like to join us or just find out more, stop by the Fire Station and chat with Chris, Mary, Crosby, Todd or Wade.

We certainly have had another hot summer with too many days over 100 degrees. Finnon Recreation Area started off pretty good this summer with campers almost every weekend. Since then, fewer campers at Finnon has reduced the revenue brought in. Help promote Finnon Recreation Area by telling your friends what a wonderful place it is.

MVFA depends on the revenue from camping, disk golf and day use to pay the Department of Water Resources our yearly fee of \$6,604. MVFA's Board does extra events every year like: Cinco de Mayo and St. Patrick's Day Dinners, Yard Sales and the MVFA picnic. All the proceeds from these events go to the Department of Water Resources for the back fees that include penalties and interest from years ago. If you choose to give a donation to MVFA for our back fees we are a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization and we will provide you with a tax deduction letter. Remember, Finnon Recreation Area is owned by MVFA, which is you the community, not SCOPOA or MFPD. The total we now owe in back fees is almost \$40,000 as of August 2014. I can't think of a better place to help than right here in your own back yard. I would hate to see us lose this wonderful asset.

I'm sad to say that John and Allison Moalli are moving off the hill. They have given so much to the community over the years always helping out in so many different areas. John has served on the Mosquito Fire Protection District Board for many years. Both Allison and John co-chaired, along with Alyson and Dave Fox, our Halloween parties, building the haunted house at the fire station with the help of many community volunteers. They have always donated food for the Christmas Dinner Baskets given to those in need on the hill. John and Allison attended almost every dinner we have had in support of MVFA and always stayed to help clean up. I think I can say, with confidence, that they will be missed by all. We thank them for all they've done for the community and wish them the best of luck in their new endeavors.
