# MOSQUITO FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT, (MFPD)

The countdown has started: conditions are already dry and volatile. Cal Fire and US Forest Service are staffed for what will likely be an active fire season.

One of our firefighters, Crosby Markgraf, heard the calling and was picked up by US Forest Service. It is a great opportunity for him to further his career and get a lot of direct experience. We are always looking for new recruits. Whether you are looking to get into the fire service or want to help the community, we have volunteer positions available. Check in at the Fire Station or check our website: <a href="https://www.mfpd.us">www.mfpd.us</a>.

There were several multi acre fires near our district during April. We expect fire season to be declared early. For many of us, the earlier the better. If you are still having controlled burns, check the weather, phone the burn information line (530) 621 5987, and be very careful to take all precautions. Everyone is on high alert so don't be surprised if a fire vehicle shows up on a smoke check.

Speaking of emergency response, who are those people in the bright yellow-orange shirts standing on the side of the road with a STOP sign? If you've lived here very long, you've probably seen them. They are volunteer members of the MFPD Support Group. These volunteers assist our firefighters during an emergency by staffing the

fire station, fielding calls, providing road control, water supply support (pump and hydrants), and food, supplies and childcare for firefighters. They also assist with evacuations and helicopter landings. They are well-equipped and well-trained, meeting once a month to learn more about their duties and to discuss recent emergency incidents in Mosquito. So if you see them out on road control, meaning they have closed a road due to an emergency situation, please remember that they are trying to protect YOU. At the same time they need to keep the emergency scene safe so that our firefighters can quickly and safely deal with the emergency situation.

At the last MFPD meeting, the board agreed to reschedule both the May 14th and June 11th regular meetings. The new dates are now Tuesday, May 26, 2015 @ 7pm and Saturday June 13, 2015 @ 10:00 am. This is not a typical event, but due to the work being done on the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year budget, it was necessary to accommodate vacation schedules and ensure full board attendance.

# FROM SCPOA (SWANSBORO COUNTRY PROPERTY OWNER'S ASSOCIATION)

Our meeting of April 16 suggested we are making progress on achieving our stated goal of increased communications among Association members. We had a substantial number of members and guests joining the Board in a discussion of several important community issues. As our communications increase, so do the stresses of the transition. The tensions between the new and old leadership surfaced and so there were moments of anger, shouting and accusation. We will continue to seek ways to move the agenda of the community ahead and bridge these disagreements.

First, let me share some important dates coming up quickly. There is an Airport/Runway committee meeting scheduled at the Fire Station for Monday, May 4 at 6:00 p.m. This is a great opportunity to learn more about how this part of our common area operates and to ask questions you might have.

We also encourage you to attend a special Board meeting on Wednesday, May 6 at 7:00 p.m. at the Fire Station where the only topic will be our roads. This will be preceded by a Roads Committee meeting at 6:00 p.m. to which you are also invited. At these two meetings, we will be identifying the roads that will be worked on this summer. To be clear, the Roads Committee (composed of all members who attend the meeting) will look at all the remaining roads and road sections needing to be done and prioritize them. Then the Board will receive and review those recommendations and determine the roads to be completed. Several days later the Board will meet in executive session to review the bids received (we are hoping for and expecting three bids) and award the contract. We expect the work to be completed by July 31, 2015.

The Dyer Lake issue was resolved in favor of adding water to the lake using the EID connection. The Board approved an allocation of up to \$6,000 which, if fully utilized, would allow us to raise the level of the lake by three to four feet. I believe it is

fair to say that the sentiment in favor of this solution comes from the belief that we should have every available source of water in the community available for fire suppression. We still have issues of evaporation and timing to consider as we begin to implement. And we will continue what has been a very cooperative and enlightening conversation with EID. We are aware that additional restrictions on the use of water will be forthcoming and so we want to proceed with this project in a way that is respectful of those changes.

The Dyer Lake decision was made on a 4-3 vote. That vote seems to reflect the sentiment of the community on this issue. Given that, I want to express my appreciation to the members of the community who have spent hours sitting with each other expressing their positions and listening to the positions of others and helping the Board arrive at its decision. Thank you.

Our next regular board meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 21<sup>st</sup>, 7:00 pm at the Fire Station.

### MOSQUITO BRIDGE UPDATE

The Mosquito Bridge was programmed under the Highway Bridge Program for \$32 Million using very preliminary cost estimates for a wide range of alternatives. A more detailed range of cost estimates for three basic alternative locations (low, mid and high) is currently being investigated in close coordination with Caltrans and FHWA for a feasible bridge solution.

In the meantime, County engineers are presenting an update on the Mosquito Bridge to the Board of Supervisors on April 28, 2015 at 2:00. This presentation will be available on the County Board of Supervisors at

The focus of this agenda item is to present the status of the Mosquito Bridge Project planning phase after the completion of geotechnical investigations, screening criteria, two public workshops, and recent Caltrans meetings to with alternatives preliminary review estimates.
