The Board wants to take this opportunity to provide updates on the vacant Fire Chief position, budget and patch funding provided by the county. First, the Board has been working on hiring a Fire Chief, but it has been a slow process. During the first phase, we conducted outreach through a fire specific internet site to make potential candidates aware of the position and the community. This outreach went to departments and personnel associated with firefighting west of the Mississippi. We had 23 applicants, and a committee narrowed the candidate pool to the top five candidates. These candidates were invited to go through a multi-staged interview process conducted in El Dorado Hills and Mosquito.

The stages of the interview process were conducted by MFPD board members, chiefs of county Fire Departments, the existing Captains with MFPD, other local board representatives, and members of the community. The candidates were then ranked based on individual scoring through the process.

A candidate was selected and given a conditional job offer and a background investigation was conducted by an outside agency. The candidate was successful in passing the background check and a job extended The Board and the candidate are now in contract negotiations. Due to Brown Act restrictions on meetings and communication, the Board can only communicate as a board on issues and act at noticed meetings. This has impacted the timeline, as has the candidate's availability. The Board's intentions are that the negotiations will be finalized within the month.

Now, to focus on the Department's budget, to date there has been a budget workshop and a budget discussion held at a regular meeting. There may be a second workshop with further discussion at the monthly meetings as we prepare the final budget. This year we did a zero based budgeting drill and worked to cut expenses and purchases to stay within the 2015-2016 budget constraints. The Board accomplished this but had to reduce spending in several areas. With costs continually increasing and equipment and gear aging, the current budget will not sustain our Department in the future. With great input from those in attendance, the Board also discussed options for creating additional income through grants, strike teams and equipment and facility usage. These are just a few of the ideas the Board and community will investigate as we move forward.

Recently, the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors approved the second year of "patch funding" of \$68K for MFPD out of a pool of \$815K shared between 5 other rural county fire districts. The dollars awarded to Mosquito had been earmarked for personnel by the past fire board and will have to be utilized for that purpose now. As always, there are strings attached. As reported in the May 8, 2015 Mountain Democrat, "In return for the funding patch, the fire districts agreed to take a number of aggressive steps toward establishing either financial solvency or making an effort to consolidate with one or more other districts."

The Board of Supervisors, who strongly indicated that the patch funding will not likely be renewed in future fiscal years, hoped that there would have been more applications for consolidation from the fire districts. The Mosquito Fire District has reached out to open discussions regarding chief sharing, full and/or functional consolidation with our neighbors-Garden Valley, Georgetown, and El Dorado Fire Districts. Those talks are no longer active but the above districts left the doors open for future consideration.

There is much to report from SCPOA as a result of activities over the past month. First and

foremost is the road resurfacing project set to happen this summer. The roads included in the plan are:

Orval Beckett Ct. Highgrade St. Peycos Dr. Dogwood Ln. Stope Ct. Tumeli Ln.

Start of Nugget Ct. Riffle Ct. Deer Park Ct.
Lupin Ct. Pine Needle Ln. Running Quail Ct.
Buckeye Ct. Pawdick Ct. Cedar Ct.

Buckeye Ct. Pawdick Ct. Ceda Ponderosa Grove Dr. Darr Ct.

In order to accomplish this level of resurfacing work, the Board took the unprecedented action of allocating \$850,000 for this project. As a result, Association reserves will now be close to \$600,000. The Board is confident that level of reserves is sufficient to cover any emergencies that might arise.

The roads remaining to be resurfaced include:

Shilo Ct Yankee John Ct. Highgrade Ct.
Top of Lawyer Dr. Dyer Ct. Slab Creek Ct.
Cable View Ct. Deer Canyon Ct. Morton Ct.

The total costs for these remaining roads in the current bid were \$212,000. These roads become the components of the next road package put out to bid. As of now, we expect the work to be done during the month of July. We will use as many means as possible to communicate the schedule once it is set. You will see our maintenance staff (Jonathan and Kevin) doing preliminary work on the selected roads between now and then.

We should also note that between the April 16, 2015 approval of funds for adding water to Dyer Lake and the EID action of May 13, 2015 in which the use of potable water to fill ponds was forbidden, we had added approximately 40,000 gallons of water which raised the level at Dyer by 7 inches. We are unable to continue to add water as a result of the EID action.

Lynda Lima informed the Board at its April 16, 2015 meeting of her resignation as Association Secretary and made her departure official as of April 23, 2015. The Board is considering the alternatives available to it to replace her.

The Board passed a resolution in support of the Mosquito Bridge project, received current financial statements, and set up a process to understand and address the issues raised regarding the lot merger resolution it passed last year and other concerns regarding its notice and posting procedures.

Water for Finnon Lake

On May 15th, Dave Angelo, Tom Harris, Ralph Hern and I met with EI Dorado Irrigation District (EID) representatives, Bob Rice and Aaron Dinsdale, to discuss a proposal from EID to provide water to Finnon Lake. As many in the community know, the process of getting water from EID to fill Finnon Lake has dragged on for almost 4 years, although EID has a contractual obligation to provide water to Finnon Lake at no charge to MVFA.
