Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association - Finnon Lake History

Thank you to everyone who attended the MVFA Community Picnic and our monthly bingo at Mosquito General. Also, a huge thank you to our volunteers and donors! We couldn't do what we do without you! This month, due to space constraints, we are skipping our usual MVFA article in favor of an article on the long history of Finnon Lake and its source of water.

In 1906, Finnon Dam was constructed by the Finnon brothers. At the time, water filled the resulting lake from the Summerfield Ditch, which was constructed by James W. Summerfield in 1854. (You can still see some remnants of the Summerfield Ditch along Stope Road, just above Highgrade.) Summerfield filed a claim for water rights in June 1889. In 1939, these water rights, after passing through several public utility companies, were transferred along with real property encompassing Finnon Dam to the Mosquito District Mutual Water Company. This company later became part of the El Dorado Irrigation District.

In 1955, the Finnon Recreation Area, including campground, lake and store, was sold for \$30,000 to the California State Wildlife Conservation Board, later becoming the California Department of Fish and Wildlife. The sale included water rights of 600 acre feet per annum that was to be used for recreation and fish culture. Through the years the actual amount of water to be provided to Finnon Lake has been reduced through sales of surrounding properties that had been part of the original Summerfield Ditch water rights filing. In 1997, Finnon Dam was condemned after an inspection which concluded that the dam could liquefy in an earthquake. The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department decided that they would purchase Finnon Recreation Area and repair the dam. It was felt that, after repairs, Finnon Recreation Area would be an important resource for the community and the fire station. The property was offered as a quitclaim deed by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife for \$1, with the understanding that in the event of a decision to sell Finnon, they would have right of first refusal at the same price.

The Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department, now the Mosquito Fire Protection District, formed a committee to undertake reconstruction of the dam and at the same time established the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association (MVFA) as a nonprofit to provide community and fire station support and hold ownership of Finnon Recreation Area. In 2004, the El Dorado Irrigation District (EID) acknowledged that, as the current owners of the Summerfield Ditch, they did need to honor the original contractual obligation to provide

station support and hold ownership of Finnon Recreation Area. In 2004, the El Dorado Irrigation District (EID) acknowledged that, as the current owners of the Summerfield Ditch, they did need to honor the original contractual obligation to provide

Finnon Lake with water. Thanks to the efforts of many dedicated volunteers, the dam was rebuilt, with the job completed in 2014. Once the dam repairs were completed, EID was reminded of their obligation to provide water to Finnon Lake. The need to acquire an easement from an adjacent property owner in order to pipe water from the EID pipeline on Rock Creek Road has delayed this process. Additionally, water from EID is chlorinated. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife will not allow chlorinated water to be introduced to Finnon Lake, so we also need a system for de-chlorination. (Just an open area which allows the chlorine to evaporate before the water makes it to the lake.) Discussions with EID regarding the easement and the de-chlorination are nearly complete, and MVFA recently received a proposal from EID to fulfill both requirements.

We will be reviewing this proposal at the next August MVFA board meeting. I do need to insert, however, that there are many who have water rights going back to the 19th century, and currently with this drought, some of those with water rights are being told that these will not be honored. But one step at a time. At this point, we are seeking a wildlife safe system to get water to Finnon Lake, and it appears that EID is close to giving us that. The complete history of this whole process makes for fascinating reading. Sadly, I do not have room for it all here, but I want to acknowledge the excellent documentation done by Lois Pearson and others. This is a great bargain for any family that is planning to visit Finnon Lake Recreation Area more than four times the remainder of this year. Camping fees are not covered by this permit.

Without a permit, a fee of \$6.00 per vehicle is requested for day use activities such as swimming, boating, fishing, picnicking and disc golf. No fee is requested for anyone (resident or not) who is only walking or bicycling in the Recreation Area. The day use fee can be paid inside the Mosquito General Market and Kitchen or, if it is not open, you can use the payment envelopes and drop box outside on the left side of the building.

MVFA is totally self-supported. We receive no funds from taxes or SCPOA, yet we have yearly costs for the Finnon Lake Recreation Area in excess of \$8,000.00. Collection of the fee helps cover these costs.
