Before You Burn

Winter is here and this year's fire season was particularly devastating to California's forestlands, wildlife, economy, people, and without question, its air quality. Proper clearing of vegetation around homes can help prevent and minimize wildfires in the future. Cleared



vegetation should be removed as green waste or composted. If you must burn, the Mosquito FPD and El Dorado County Air Quality Management District (AQMD) wishes to remind residents of the "What, When, Where and How" of proper and legal outdoor Open Burning. Instead of Burning, use green waste collection or compost it!

What

- Dry vegetation originating from the property on which it will be burned.
- If it's going to rain, cover your pile to keep it dry. Do not burn the cover.
- Don't burn just pine needles as they will smolder; add wood for more heat.

When

- On designated Burn Days (call the BURN LINE 530-621-5897 or 866-621-5897)
- When local weather conditions are appropriate.
- With a burn permit available at Mosquito Fire Station 75 or CAL FIRE.

Where

- On the property from which the dry vegetation originated.
- In areas where it's safe to burn, away from combustibles, with an adequate water supply and means to contact emergency personnel.

How

- In accordance with Air District Rule 300 Open Burning.
- In accordance with any other applicable requirements from the Mosquito Fire Protection District, CAL FIRE, or US Forest Service. (CAL FIRE (530) 644-2345)

Smoke nuisance complaints are the most common complaints the AQMD and MFPD receive during burn season. While you are allowed to burn vegetation under certain conditions, you do not have a right to inundate your neighbors with smoke and cause a nuisance. The information above and at the Air District's Open Burning website below is intended to help residents burn properly and avoid creating a nuisance and degrading air quality: http://www.edcgov.us/Government/AirQualityManagement/Burn Information (Outdoor).aspx

As a reminder, the California Health & Safety Code Section 42400 gives AQMD the authority to levy fines to persons who violate AQMD Rules, including Rule 300 Open Burning. The AQMD also has a compliance course that violators may be required to complete.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)-The El Dorado County Home Energy Assistance Program can help El Dorado County families pay their utility bills and improve the energy efficiency of their homes.



Households may qualify for assistance with their electric bill or receive a \$400 credit towards their propane, wood, pellet or kerosene. Households can apply for HEAP once a year. If you are currently on the CARE Program, you are still eligible to apply for HEAP.

Answer these **five** questions to see if you should apply for HEAP.

I have received HEAP assistance in the last 12 months	Yes/No
I currently have a past due notice on my PG&E account	Yes/No
In winter, I use propane, wood, pellets or kerosene in my home	Yes/No
In winter, my heating bill goes up and it's difficult to pay my utility bills	Yes/No
I would like to save money on my home energy costs	Yes/No

If you answered YES to any of the above questions, you may qualify for HEAP.

The application process is easy and takes less than 15 minutes. Pre-approval can be made over the phone.
