Fire Season Preparation

The fire season is upon us and with the severe drought, the Mosquito Fire Protection District would like everyone to remember, **"Ready, Set, Go!"** when it comes to wildfires. **"Being Ready"** starts by maintaining 100 feet of defensible space and reinforcing homes with fire resistant building materials. **"Being Set"** includes an evacuation plan and Emergency Preparedness Kits. Lastly, when a wildfire strikes, residents are urged to **"Go!"** and evacuate early. The MFPD suggests the tips below for safety:

Weed Abatement

- Maintain 100-foot clearance around your homes, barns and other buildings. The first 30 feet should be cleared of dead brush, grass, leaves and other vegetation. The remaining 70 feet needs to be cleared of low-hanging branches and any other natural or manmade fuels that will allow fire to spread rapidly.
- Use power equipment on cool mornings before 10 a.m. Do not use this equipment during the heat of the day and when the wind is blowing.
- Limit use of lawnmowers on dry grass or brush and make sure to remove rocks around the area before operating such equipment.
- Portable gas powered equipment must be equipped with an exhaust pipe spark arrester and should never be re-fueled while equipment is hot from use.
- Keep private driveways and roads maintained for fire department apparatus. Ensure low hanging branches to not impede fire engine response.
- Remove rubbish and obstructions from your property.
- Remember to inspect your property periodically and abate any re-growth throughout the fire season. Doing this will give firefighting crews an increased chance to protect you and your property.

Grilling Safety Tips

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors. Never leave your grill unattended.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets away from grilling area.

History of MFPD-MVFA Separation

Based on its founding documents and in keeping with both its fiduciary responsibility and its policy of openness, transparency, and full disclosure, the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association (MVFA) operates as a non-political, independent, volunteer-run, community-support and education organization with no financial connection, actual or implied, with the taxpayer-financed Mosquito Fire Protection District (MFPD).

Complete MVFA financial reports are produced and made public every month at MVFA board meetings.

When the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department (MVFD) purchased the Finnon Lake property in 1997, concern was expressed about the confusion in name and function between the MFPD and the new Finnon owners, MVFD. So, in order to protect the MFPD taxpayers from any legal liabilities, taxes, fees, and penalties associated with the property holdings acquired through Finnon's purchase, it was agreed by both parties that the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Department would legally change its name to the Mosquito Volunteer Fire Association. According to IRS tax code and state law, as a 501(c)(3) charity, MVFA can make distributions only to other 501(c)(3) organizations and is prohibited from appearing to endorse or support political candidates and from attempting to influence legislation. MVFA will continue to encourage education of fire risks in our district, actively support the chief and the fire department, and promote social activities among district residents. In addition, MVFA will continue to maintain the MVFA Station 75 Fund (as well as other funds, at the discretion of its Board of Directors) for the purpose of purchasing firefighting tools and equipment for use by Station 75, and to purchase these items upon written request by the chief, according to MVFA policy.

Birding at Finnon Lake

MVFA has a responsibility to monitor the birds, bats, mammals, and fish at Finnon Lake as part of a mitigation obligation of the dam project. To cover the bird monitoring, I have been taking monthly bird walks on the trail around the lake for the past few months and have come across a fair number of species that are always enjoyable to see and hear. To get a more comprehensive list, we ask anyone birding Finnon to help us by supplying us with your sightings. The easiest way to do this is through www.eBird.org which is a birding website utilized across the world to log bird species and locations of sightings. If using ebird.org please call the location **Finnon Lake**.



Another easy way is to use the birding website is www.birdseyebirding.com which will tell you what birds have been seen in the area recently and what birds are normally in the area. If you use www.birdseyebirding.com, your sightings automatically upload to the Cornell Ornithology Lab which is the holder of all things bird related. If you are interested in recording your findings and need help, you can contact me at nancy9foley@gmail.com and I will help you through the process. I have also given a couple of paper Bird Lists of El Dorado County to Mosquito General. Then you can hold a list in your hand and see what might be flying around. As for bird books and bird applications related to bird identification, [Sibley's Field Guide to Birds of Western North America](#) is one of my favorite books. The **IBird Pro App** also has great information, pictures, audible sounds of the birds and their general range.

Another easy way is to use the birding website is www.birdseyebirding.com which will tell you what birds have been seen in the area recently and what birds are normally in the area. If you use www.birdseyebirding.com, your sightings automatically upload to the Cornell Ornithology Lab which is the holder of all things bird related. If you are interested in recording your findings and need help, you can contact me at nancy9foley@gmail.com and I will help you through the process. I have also given a couple of paper Bird Lists of El Dorado County to Mosquito General. Then you can hold a list in your hand and see what might be flying around. As for bird books and bird applications related to bird identification, Sibley's Field Guide to Birds of Western North America is one of my favorite books. The IBird Pro App also has great information, pictures, audible sounds of the birds and their general range.
