

## **Chief's Corner**



While we are still technically in the "Wildland Fire Season", winter is just around the corner, so here's some things you might want to start considering:

- 1. **Check batteries** in smoke detectors and if not already done, **install a carbon monoxide detector**. One for every bedroom is suggested.
- 2. Have your **chimney checked** and cleaned by a licensed professional.
- 3. **Clean you gutters** of pine needles and other debris that may have accumulated over the summer. An overflowing gutter could result in you attempting a risky maneuver like trying to climb a ladder in the middle of a rain storm.
- 4. Make sure you **obtain a burn permit** for when open burning is again permitted. You can get one by stopping by the fire station during business hours. Also remember that you must follow the instructions before you light burn piles, including calling the number listed on the permit before you burn.
- 5. Please **be smart and drive safely!** The first few rains generally result in slippery roads here in the foothills. Have your vehicle checked out: tires, brakes, antifreeze and chains etc. If we get a sudden snow and you're not an experienced driver in the snow, stay put! Stay home, stay at a friend's, or stay at work. The snow will generally melt rather quickly up here and you will get home eventually.

She served diligently on your board as Director, Treasurer and Secretary. Eileen's thoughtfulness and sensitivity served our community well during her term on the board and she will be missed. Changing circumstances may make some rules outmoded, and boards should review the rules every few years to make sure they are serving the community. The SCPOA's Ad hoc DC&R and Bylaw Committee is in the process of completing the re-write of SCPOA's Bylaws and CC&Rs. Thanks to the hard work of Debbie Harris, Marty Dominguez and all the hard working committee members, we are close to presenting the proposed changes to the community-at-large. In the meantime, if you don't like a rule, please contact the committee. Get involved rather than waiting until you are dissatisfied about something.

SCPOA is charged with maintaining millions of dollars' worth of property. Board members are not typically trained in property management, accounting and the law. Communities are dependent upon the skills and personalities that residents and board members bring to the table. Communications and transparency are paramount. Your board must be very clear about how money is handled. While lawyers and accounting can be expensive, they are needed from time to time. While it may seem wasteful to spend money on management, accounting and legal tasks, not doing so usually ends up being far more expensive. We are fortunate that SCPOA employs a very competent manager, accountant and attorney.

Every community has a few people who think the rules don't apply to them, and some would rather fight than comply. Unfortunately, we are dealing with that situation currently. A court battle can be costly, both in money and in emotional turmoil within the community. All homeowner's need to be reasonable and considerate. That applies to both the homeowners and those who accept the challenge of volunteering to serve on the SCPOA board. We can all work together for the betterment of the community.

California State laws require financial reserves. It always makes sense to plan for items we know will have to be replaced and or repaired such as roads, the airport and other common area property. We need to be adaptable for both short and long range projects and work as a team managing our community. I pledge, to the best of my ability, to serve the community by following the SCPOA bylaws, state laws, SCPOA's considerable history, the advice of our manager, attorney, common sense and most importantly, by listening to you, the members of this great community.
