Middletown Holiday Home Tour Home Owner Guidelines 2023

The Middletown Holiday Home Tour has been a Middletown tradition for over 20 years. 100% of Tour proceeds directly benefit the Middletown Area Blue Raiders Foundation's IEP Scholarship Program.

The Home Tour will be held on December 9th from 12:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. We typically expect 50 - 100 guests. If you choose to participate you may show as much or as little of your home as you please. You may want to ask a friend or family member to help check tickets and greet guests.

Guests are reminded of the following on their Ticket:

- Guests may be asked to wear a face covering or mask.
- Guests may be asked to remove shoes prior to entering the tour home
- No pets or smoking will be allowed inside the tour home
- Accident disclaimer printed on both ticket and brochure
- Tour will be held regardless of weather
- Some homes are not handicapped accessible

We will need a picture of your home for the Tour program. If you have a great picture of the outside of your home (maybe even decorated for the holidays) please send it to me or I can scan a photo for you if you have one that you love but is not digital. I will also need a brief write-up for your home to include in the program. We would be happy to help you with this, just let us know. It would be great if we could have all of this by November 1, 2023.

During the tour, some homeowners like to lead their tour guests in groups, others simply allow guests to leisurely stroll through the home and are available to answer questions. This is up to you. If you are showing your second floor, you may want to have a friend or relative "Room Sit" to help direct guests.

In the past, some home owners have offered light refreshments such as mulled cider, egg nog, hot chocolate, coffee, cookies and candies, etc. This is totally optional! You may have holiday music playing or maybe you have a musician friend to help provide live music. Use your imagination and have fun with it! Show off your collections. They do not have be holiday specific items. In the past, home owners have featured the following: train displays, antique wood working tool collection, handmade miniature figurine displays, Hess truck collection, Penn State collection, personal hobbies and crafts, etc. If you have restored or remodeled you home, display before and after pictures. This is also something people love to see.

Stacey Miller, local area artist and art teacher in the Middletown Area School District, will be creating a watercolor painting of all tour homes. If you like, you may display the painting in your home during the tour. You will also have the opportunity to purchase the painting from Stacey. This is optional.
