# From the Desk of Pastor Julie Higgs

#### **Dear Partners in Ministry**

I am so very delighted to be your interim pastor! I love worshiping with you, visiting with you, sharing meals with you, working with you, and seeing so much ministry that you are doing in Christ's name through Zion Lutheran Church! Even with the commute from Dubuque, even while my husband was in a care center, I love being a part of this congregation! Thank you for trusting me to be a companion with you on the holy ground of your lives.

#### As We Continue to Get to Know Each Other ...

I've learned that people have very different ideas about when they should contact their pastor. Here are some times I hope you'll contact me:

- When you're facing surgery or medical procedures or significant tests.
- When you're hospitalized.
- When you or somebody you deeply love is nearing death.
- When you and your family are feeling upended by life.
- When you have questions about Jesus, Lutherans, other Christians, God, how your faith and your politics should inform each other, other faiths, the Bible, etc.
- When you're afraid.
- When you have a fire or significant storm damage at your home.
- When you're struggling with your identity, your sexuality, your career, your significant relationships, your life.
- And whenever you wonder, "should I contact my pastor?"

  At all those times and many other times as well, the answer.

At all these times and many other times as well, the answer is, "Yes, please contact me." I'm no expert in all these things, but I'm here to pray with you and to share Christ's love for you by walking with you through whatever circumstances your life brings.

#### What's Next in the Call Process?

Last month I set out the four major steps in the call process: leave-taking, preparation, discernment, and walking together. We're currently in the second step—preparation—where we will review Zion's ministry and uncover hopes and intentions for what's to come.

**Timelines.** In May, you'll find some timelines set out for you to participate by noting significant events in the last 25 years of life of this congregation. But not just this congregation. We'll also

have three additional partial timelines where you can include some of the significant events in the lives of the congregations many of you called home before coming to Zion, especially New Hope, Chancy, and Immanuel. As each of those congregations closed, we invite you to show when you decided to worship at Zion.

Please grab a marker and add to the timeline: when you joined or started worshiping at Zion; when someone in your life was baptized, confirmed, married, or buried at Zion or these other churches; when we began something that you found life-giving; when we stopped doing something. There will be space at the beginning of each timeline to list things that were done continuously during the last 25 years—or until your earlier congregation closed. Adorn the timeline with emojis to express how you felt at various times about the ministries of your congregation.

As the timelines get fuller and fuller, we'll keep reviewing them to see what we can learn about our ministry, your needs, and potential directions for our future.

**Gatherings.** During the call process, we'll have a number of opportunities to gather in groups both large and small. I'd like to begin by having gatherings for those of you who attended New Hope, Chancy, or Immanuel. I'll be in touch with those of you we know came from one of those congregations to schedule a time to gather. If you came to Zion from congregations other than those listed and would like to share experiences from those congregations, please let me know, and I'll try to schedule another gathering

**Call Committee Process.** At the May Council meeting, Pastor Dan Kuckuck, an assistant to our bishop, will attend and walk the Council through the entire process of gathering information, forming a Call Committee, creating a Ministry Site Profile—the document that prospective candidates will receive to learn about Zion, interviewing candidates, and moving forward to a congregational meeting to call our next pastor.

Once the Call Committee is formed, they'll take over providing regular updates to the congregation. At a minimum, they'll put an article in each month's Courier describing both the process and progress. But you can also expect to see occasional announcements in the weekly bulletin and during the time for announcements at the beginning of worship.

**Your Participation.** Your participation is vital for us to understand as fully as possible the needs and dreams of our community of faith. Please be attentive to the information about the call process and participate as fully as possible now, by putting things on the timeline, and throughout the coming months, by responding to the council's or Call Committee's requests for input. And please hold our leaders in prayer throughout this journey.

Tuition for our 3 year-old preschool classes is \$185 per month. Our 4 year-old program participates in the 4 year-old voluntary preschool grant with the Clinton Community School District and the State of Iowa.... any 4 year old that lives in Iowa has FREE tuition for preschool. 





# **New Zion Library Books for May 2024**



**The Anxious Generation** by Jonathan Haidt is a book all parents should read! It describes how a smart phone-based childhood has replaced a play-based childhood depriving children of experiences and interactions with other children that are necessary for their development. And then he gives ideas for what parents and communities can do about it....From Joyce King Memorial Fund.

Serenity at 70, Gaiety at 80: Why you should keep on getting older is a book written by humorist Garrison Keillor (Lake Wobegon) about the wondrous event of growing older. "Every day is a beautiful gift, tender and precious and swift, the light and the sound, the sky and the ground, every hour cries out to be lived. Though I may be over the hill, still I think I can and I will, I've forgotten just what I can and will, but they remain a goal of mine still."






Margaret Truman (yes, Pres. Truman's daughter) was a prolific crime novel writer. *Murder at Union Station*, published in 2004, tells about an aspiring author who is in big trouble. He interviews a now aging hitman for organized crime, but after this person is killed at the railroad station in Washington D.C., he realizes that the tapes of his interviews make him a marked man. "From the corridors of power to a brutal DC ghetto, everyone wants those tapes...." Ms. Truman died in 2008 at age 83. This book is large print.

#### Summary of Congregation Council Minutes – March 12, 2024

(The full minutes are posted on the bulletin board near the church office.)

Pastor Julie was welcomed by President Morehead to her first Council meeting.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Julie will be meeting with each Council member to get acquainted. A sign-up sheet was available for each member to choose a date and time for their meeting.

Membership Update: Pastor Julie shared the membership update with the Council.

**Treasurer's Report:** Deb Vath, David Meade and Amanda Deuermeyer are working together to review all the financial accounts. It was reported that in February expenses exceeded income, however, YTD income has exceeded budget. Deb also reviewed certain line items on each of the financial reports so that the Council has a complete understanding of the information reported there. Linda Dutchess moved to accept the Treasurer's report and Patti Lauritzen seconded the motion. All ayes.

**Committee Reports:** It was reported to the Council that the Fellowship and Evangelism committees will be working together on a potluck held in May. Linda Dutchess moved to approve the standing Committee reports en bloc. Marsha Smith seconded the motion. All ayes.

#### **Old Business:**
