Several of the photos above are from Palm Sunday. Calvary celebrated the entry into Holy Week with great fanfare and excitement. The Children sang their song and we waved our palms as we gave witness to the words of the crowd, as though we were there, "Hosanna in the Highest!" Holy Week carries our expectant hopes through the denial, betrayal, mock trial, crucifixion and death of Jesus. Holy Week holds our questions, our doubts. It brings us to the promise and hope of the resurrection. Easter! When some Pharisees try to silence the people on that first Palm Sunday, Jesus is quoted as saying, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." (Luke 19:40 NRSV). In this passage, Jesus seems to be saying that even part of creation will bear witness to the messiah including the stones. Stones are enduring markers. Think the archeological sites in the Holy Land, the Temple Mount in Jerusalem, or other lasting stone structures. Yet, it is not only monumental stonework that shout out. Indeed the change of the season, Spring, also proclaims resurrection after cold dark winter. The word Easter comes from Proto-Germanic word, Austron, which means "to shine". Not only is creation returning and the days are getting longer. The whole creation is shouting out and proclaiming the resurrection of the Light of Christ. We hear with renewed emphasis the prophet Isaiah, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. (Isaiah 9:2-3 NRSV) This passage is often heard at Christmas, yet it provides a connection between Christmas and Easter so clearly. Therefore beloved of God at Calvary, don't let anyone or anything silence you witness to the resurrection work of God in Christ. Yet, even if we are silent, the stone and all creation will continue to shout out! The light has shined on us, let us Rejoice! **Blessed Easter!**

A NOTE FROM PASTOR JARED



Paul wrote or dictated the earliest surviving Christian manuscripts. Early Christians thought so highly of Paul's writings that they saved them and distributed them to other Christian communities. The epistle of Philippians, as we have it, was likely at least two separate letters from Paul



(3:2-4:9 [4:10-19] and 1:1-3:1), which were saved together as one document and not in chronological order. In the letter to the Philippians as it has been handed on to us, we hear Paul emphasize "joy" or "rejoice" fourteen times, the most notable occurrence is in verse 4:4. This exhortation to joy and rejoicing comes in the face of Paul's own imprisonment and reports Paul has received about divisions in the Philippian community. Paul encourages these in the midst of conflict to seek peace and unity "in Christ." This unity looks like having the same mind that was in Christ Jesus (see the "Christ hymn" of Philippians 2:1-11), a sacrificial self-giving.

Paul's words of exhortation and encouragement remain relevant for the community of faith today. The conflicts or brokenness that we experience might be different from the first century community in Philippi, but the joy of the gospel still brings unity and invites us to think beyond our own needs to have the same mind of Christ. This Christ-mindedness is what Paul gives thanks for in verse 4:10-19. The Philippians sent a messenger, Epaphroditus, to Paul with a letter and a financial gift to help Paul continue the work of proclaiming the gospel. (Note: some biblical scholars see these verses as being a fragment of a distinct third letter.) For Paul, the partnership in the gospel, the bonds of peace and unity in Christ, and the sharing of financial gifts are all related. Conforming our minds to that of Christ Jesus is what allows us to endure shame, suffering, and even death - death on a cross. And so, God exalted (raised) Jesus. Together, we are encouraged to see the ways the Spirit alters our perspective, transforms our communities, and consistently blazes a trail ahead of us. Walking the path of Lent allows us to see that while the road is marked with pain, grief, or uncertainty as we move towards the cross of Good Friday, we know that the cross isn't the end of the story. For now we sit in the ashes of our broken hearts, but do so knowing that God sits here with us and that Easter is coming.

On Sunday, March 31, we celebrated with joy the Resurrection of our Lord, Easter! The resurrection occupies center space in the life of Christian communities and emphasizes the joy of Christ's resurrection and victory over death and by faith, we trust that we are "in Christ," being raised. Easter is a season, not just a day. It is a "week of weeks" (7 weeks of 7 days) in which we hear the stories of resurrection and celebrate Christ's victory.

This Easter season, I invite people to make one or more 15-30 second cell phone video clips responding to these prompts:

- Why do you REJOICE in the knowledge of resurrection?
- When have you been able to REJOICE in the midst of struggles?
- How have you seen the people of Calvary Lutheran Church REJOICE?
- What things are happening at Calvary Lutheran Church that cause you to REJOICE?
- I REJOICE in what God is doing at Calvary Lutheran through my financial gifts because...

FINANCE - 2024 FINANCE REPORT

February's income was considerably higher than the prior year and was a wonderful blessing. As in January, there were a few larger gifts, that timing wise, were given in a different month in 2023.

February's events calendar began with Calvary serving a meal at Christus Rex on UND's campus. Ash Wednesday began the Lenten season on February 14. In the past, Calvary's high school youth have served a meal each week in Lent. This year, the youth will serve two of the six meals, but four other groups have volunteered to provide a meal for our congregation on Wednesday evening. The willingness to say "yes" to serving once again shows how Calvary is embracing our congregationally owned ministry that we embody. Another example of how our congregation continues to show up joyfully is through our noisy offering. Noisy offering in February was collected for the Honduras mission in the amount of \$1,115.90.

Calvary's year-to-date income through February is more than 21% higher than our five-year average and our expenses were only slightly higher than the five-year average. We are so thankful how our members and friends continue to support and embrace all the ministries Calvary does within our walls as well as in our community and the world.

OLD BUSINESS

Visitation ministry progress. The first of a two-part visitation training has occurred led by Pastor Jared. Pastor Aaron, staff member, Mary Ann Devig, and seven congregation members are enrolled. A wide range of ages is represented with more members interested in a potential future class.

Employee Handbook update. Gina Sanders and Pastor Jared met last week to discuss updates. A revised handbook will be presented to the council at a future meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Change request in Pastor Jared's housing allocation.

A compensation package approved at the time of hire for Pastor Jared was reviewed concerning salary and housing allocation. An adjustment to decrease salary and increase housing allocation creates no change in expense to Calvary. A motion made to approve this housing allocation request was made by Heather Burchill and seconded by Alicia Houle. Motion passed.

Silent auction items for Totally Tables. Update from President Diane Stoley with invitation from Morgan asking council for items for the silent auction.

Remaining paternity leave. Pastor Aaron Bye made a request to the council for his remaining three weeks of paternity leave. (Splitting leave to best serve Calvary during Lent and Easter was approved before Pastor Aaron's leave.) Three weeks remain on Aaron's paternity leave. Colleen Carlson made a motion to accept Pastor Aaron's proposal as written. Alicia Houle seconded the motion; Gina Sanders called for a question. Pastor Jared Carson recommended continuing discussion during the Council huddle.

THE GIFTCARD EMAIL

If you receive an email from anyone you don't know, or even from someone you do know, that asks you to get gift cards for them in a dollar amount, this is 100% a scam/phishing email.

First thing to do is to check the email address. If it looks weird, then it's not from the person they say they are. Next, report it as spam and delete it.

If you have replied to the email, don't worry, just report as spam and delete.

Backpack Program:




