A NOTE FROM PASTOR JARED: "DO NOT BE AFRAID"



Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ at Calvary Lutheran Church,

Do not be afraid! I bring you good tidings of great joy: Grace, peace, and love to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus, the Christ! "Do not be afraid!" is one of the most common greetings that a messenger of God gives to people in scripture. So, it seems appropriate that I, a preacher and teacher of the gospel, share this message with you. God's grace, peace, and love ARE, and have been, with you. Therefore, do not be afraid during this time of pastoral transition.

My name is Jared Carson, and I am pleased to share that the Congregation Council of Calvary selected me to serve as your Intentional Interim Pastor. My ministry among you began on December 17. I will provide worship leadership, education, and pastoral care to the congregation as we walk together in faith. My family is relatively new to North Dakota. We moved to West Fargo, ND, from southern New Mexico in the fall of 2021. My wife Laura Carson, a rostered deacon in the ELCA, has been called to serve as Associate with the Bishop for Formation and Administration in the Eastern North Dakota Synod. She and I are graduates of Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary in Columbia, South Carolina. We have served together as a ministry team for more than 14 years in both Torrance, CA, and Las Cruces, NM. We have two boys, Andrew (12) and Aaron (10). Most recently, I served as the interim pastor at St. John Lutheran Church in Fargo, ND. My journey of ministry has been guided by the Holy Spirit and marked by: relationship building, love of worship, welcoming the stranger, caring for others, and equipping disciples for direct service to the wider community.

While at St. John Lutheran, that congregation and I grieved with you the death of Pr. Kirk. No one could possibly be like or replace Pr. Kirk. He was uniquely gifted by God for the ministry. Part of my task, as your Intentional Interim Pastor, is to make space for those who still need time to grieve Kirk's death and to help the staff and congregation members navigate the changes in the congregation system caused by Kirk's absence. We know that individuals can experience grief, and it makes sense then that groups of people hold grief collectively, too. Acknowledging grief doesn't mean people are crying all the time...grief can simply be expressed as frustration that things aren't the way they once were.

While pastoral transitions are not new (just consult the New Testament Epistles), I encourage you again with these words, "Do not be afraid!"

In our baptismal liturgy and in our rite of welcome to new members, we ask people to make the following commitment:

- "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:
- + to live among God's faithful people,
- + to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- + to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- + and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?"

And in turn we respond, not simply with a "yes." But with a bold declaration of trust in the God who is present to us, saying, "I will, and I ask God to help and guide me." And with God's help and guidance we have no reason to be afraid.

I look forward to meeting you all and serving together at Calvary Lutheran Church.

FINANCE - 2023 FINANCE REPORT

November's giving was considerably lower than the prior year. The timing of larger gifts made the difference when comparing monthly receipts from the current and prior year. In 2022, there were three large annual gifts in November that have not yet occurred in the current year.

Noisy offering in November was collected for Angel Tree and UND Mortar Board for their Thanksgiving turkey baskets in the amount of \$431. The November events calendar continued with regularly scheduled worship, education classes and youth events. Some of the annual events occurring in November were All Saints Day and remembering our loved ones, a Milestone event titled "Remembering Your Baptism" for first graders and the Advent Festival.

Income through November was 3% lower than the five-year average while expenses were 3.7% lower for the same time period. While Calvary's financials look more promising than one year ago, giving in December will be a factor as we determine what ministry looks like for the coming year. As Calvary finishes the financial year, please pray for our congregation to continue to support all the good things Calvary is able to share within our walls as well as in our community.



2 breakfast & lunch items


2 fruit items


















All Ages Book Club
