A NOTE FROM PASTOR AARON:



I recently had coffee with a friend the other day, and we soon found our conversation had moved to the topic of perfection. Knowing full well that perfection is impossible, it didn't stop us from wondering about all of the ways we all try to live up to the unattainable expectations of perfection. Whether set by ourselves, others, or even the world we live in; we often see our need for perfection come out in the way that we treat our bodies, our grades, our careers,



our relationships, our families, our legacy, and even our places of worship and community. Next thing we know, we find ourselves striving to grab ahold of the next quick fix or self-improvement plan that will finally get us to this goal. We hope to live up to our New Year's resolutions and find ourselves creating bigger and bigger goals to achieve. Yet we know that the perfection we are all striving for is impossible without the unconditional grace of God.

In a season traditionally marked with giving things up, to what end? Is it really to make us feel more connected to God or is it again a mark of perfection? Proving to ourselves that we have the discipline that others may be lacking. So in this season of Lent, instead of striving for perfection, what would happen if we let the Holy Spirit alter our perception? What if we stepped back this Lent and recognized that we are all beautifully imperfect? And through this imperfection, the Holy Spirit comes to each of us where we are, how we are, and helps alter our perception through God's perfect love. And through this love we see that life is beautiful and life is hard, for everyone.

Together, we are encouraged to see the ways the Spirit alters our perspective, transforms our communities, and consistently blazes a trail ahead of us. Walking the path of Lent allows us to see that while the road is marked with pain, grief, or uncertainty as we move towards the cross of Good Friday, we know that the cross isn't the end of the story. For now we sit in the ashes of our broken hearts, but do so knowing that God sits here with us and that Easter is coming.

So I invite you to wonder with me. How will we see the Spirit transforming our perceptions? How will we invite others into this journey as beloved instead of as competition? How will the Spirit move our hearts away from the need for perfection and towards the way of grace and love? Because the Spirit is alive in, with, and under our ordinary lives, always calling us forward into transformation, nudging us into wholeness, and beckoning us forth into an alternative way.

FINANCE - 2024 FINANCE REPORT

Income in January was 32% higher than our prior year which is always a promising start to the new year. There were several large annual gifts given in January that we did not see in the prior year January.

January events included the Honduras rummage sale, New Member Sunday, and Calvary's annual meeting. The Honduras team raised \$23,000 through the rummage sale to be used to support the lunch program and medical care in El Triunfo, Honduras. Calvary welcomed five families on New Member Sunday. Before the annual meeting, Calvary youth served a pancake breakfast as a fundraiser for their trip to New Orleans this summer for the National Youth Gathering. Calvary collected \$844 for the Good Samaritan fund.

Year-to-date income through January was 11% higher than the five-year average, while expenses were also higher at 3%. Each year the goal for financials is to stay consistent or improve over the prior year. Our prayers as a team are for the congregation to continue to support Calvary through their time, talents, and gifts.

Interim Ministry Update - Forming a Transition Team

The contract that Calvary has with Pr. Jared is for ministry through May 2025. The initial task for Pr. Jared has been to build relationships with staff, congregation council, and congregation participants. He explained to the council and members that as the Intentional Interim Lead Pastor he has two functions,

- 1) to be the pastor of the congregation for the specified time
- 2) to serve as a consultant/guide to the congregation and leaders. The work of a consultant/guide is not undertaken alone. Pr. Jared will be working with a Transition Team. The Transition Team will guide the



congregation in answering the question, "Where are we going?" The old adage, "if you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there" is true. The transition team is a time limited commitment of 6-9 months and will meet every other week with Pr. Jared learning and planning. Then the Transition Team will put into practice their learning and lead the congregation through some large group conversation. Finally, the Transition Team will draft the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which a Call Committee (to be formed in the future) will use to interview and identify a pastoral candidate. This process might seem long, but it will go by very quickly. The congregation will emerge with a better communal sense of identity, purpose, and mission in the Grand Forks community.


