
## **Bring Back The Tax Disc**

A few months ago I had a narrow escape from a speeding driver in a narrow residential street. I managed to note the registration and on checking, surprise, surprise, his car was untaxed since December 2020. I reported it that day through Gov.uk and again when I spotted it a week later. Today I checked the car's status and, this time no surprise – it's still untaxed. This situation is replicated throughout the UK, where car tax evasion has hit a record high since 2014, when paper discs were axed. (Source Department of Transport). Some number crunching. One in 50 vehicles are untaxed, costing the UK £119m a year. Scotland has the second highest rate of evasion, second only to Northern Ireland. These figures also take into consideration that estimates for motorcycles have, for the first time, been omitted from the statistics due to "insufficient sample size", though the DfT believes that the impact is "very small" on overall compliance rates. Some 1.9% of all vehicles on UK roads are untaxed – almost 720,000, up from 1.6% in 2019, the last time evasion levels were analysed. Vehicle tax dodging is more than three times higher than under paper discs. The DfT claims to have a range of comprehensive enforcement measures, including penalties

and prosecutions, through to the use of Automatic Number Plate Recognition cameras, wheel-clamping and the removal of untaxed vehicles. Yet, incredibly, and as my own experience showed, 13% of the untaxed have been so for more than a year.

Draw your own conclusion.

With such staggering evasion rates there's a real concern that other drivers will think "Why should I pay?" and even more revenue, which could be used to improve the road network, will be lost. While



it's virtually unheard of for Governments to admit that they made a mistake, motorists and their organisations should be lobbying politicians to restore the tax disc. Simple, cheap to administer and, for those which require one, an instant visual proof of a vehicle's status.
