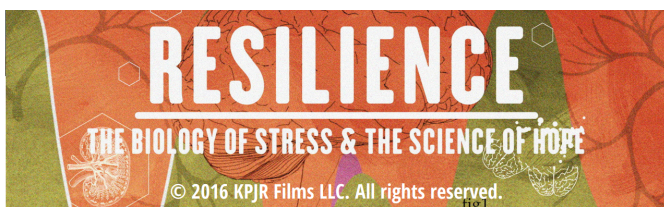

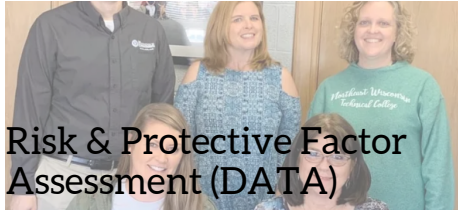

Resource Assessment

This group put on an annual Key Leader Meeting in November about Communities That Care process, programs, workgroups, and future goals. It was well attended by community partners and supporters. We have also been hard at work on the new resource rTown App. This has been a challenging process, but due to the dedication and hard it is now ready for use in Menominee County, and is nearly ready for use in Marinette County. Four billboards have been placed, lunch and learns are currently being scheduled, and flyers. In addition, an educational showing on Resilience will be at the Mariner on February 25th from 5:30pm to 6:30pm. Finally, the workgroup is aware there are several other community needs as a result of a shortage of resources. This is a topic of discussion, and we hope to continue improving our community resources, and knowledge of resources available to community members.





Risk & Protective Factor Assessment (DATA)

The Risk and Protective Factors work group has received the data report for the latest round of survey data. The group completed their training to assess this data and has evaluated the results. There were some challenges in analyzing the data as a different survey company was used this year compared to 2 years ago. Questions asked of youth were comparable however, and new risk and protective factors are being identified for the next cycle of community intervention.

The Youth Involvement Workgroup has finally met with all schools in Marinette County and Menominee County to promote the Healthy Youth Coalition, Botvin's Life Skills training, Youth Mental Health First Aid training, and to offer other education and support at request of the schools. Moving forward, we will continue to support the schools and staff with their established Healthy Youth Coalitions and other educational needs. We are also in the process of planning some challenges and awards for youth led organizations,

and to celebrate the successes of our youth. In terms of prevention education in the community, we had a successful turnout at the Vaping Town Hall put on at the UW-Marquette Campus in December. This event included a motivational speaker, local data and trends presentation, and outstanding panelists presenting knowledge from the field and from lived experiences. In addition to this event, we continue to do educational presentations on the facts, risks, and dangers of vaping, will begin creating educational resource posters, and continue to implement other ideas to change knowledge, environments, and norms when it comes to e-cigarette use.
