Alcohol & Tobacco Products/ Policy

Students placed neon-colored stickers on packages of alcohol at grocery and convenience stores from Wallace to Powers. These stickers discourage buvers from providing alcohol to minors. We are planning two parent education opportunities. Locations for these events will be North Central High School on January 10 and Niagara High School on January 11.
