



I Care Enough International Ministries (ICE), Short-Term Mission Trips.



Short term trips allows one to experience the methods, daily challenges, and impact of international missions. Short-term mission trips also helps one to grow personally. We grow the most when we are out of our comfort zone, and short-term trips are a great opportunity to stretch us.

Short-term mission trips require you to be flexible, humble, patient and gracious, while learning to navigate a new place and a new culture.



Are you ready for one of the most amazing experiences of your life? Are you ready to be stretched? Your short-term experiences will help you, to become an advocate, for prayer, giving , and mobilizing your community to reach all nations.



International Mission Trips: Go with a team or as an individual, go for as little as 12 days or as long as 6 months.

How you can serve . Once you have signed up to join a mission team, we will contact you and work with you to choose areas, dates and ministries you would like to serve in. Next, we will provide training before you leave the states, and while you are serving on the field. Once on the field you will work with an experienced local missionary. Each morning on the field you will be invited to join training classes to explain the days ministry.

The cost: Your plane ticket plus 700 dollars in-country expenses (Estimate). This is based on a 12-day trip.

Expenses not covered in the cost, your passport, visa, personal needs, vaccinations, souvenirs, travel insurance, snacks, food during travel from USA to designated country and back.

Once a team is scheduled to leave the states, leaders in the country you are traveling to, and the USA, sort through travel logistics and ministry opportunities to plan the trip. Meaningful mission trips create life-changing opportunities, both for participants and the communities they come alongside. But these meaningful experiences often don't happen without a significant amount of effort and planning by our organization, for those reasons **its never too early to start planning for your next mission trip.**

Such as Nepal, Uganda, and India. A gate way city or zone is a relatively safe location that allows our students to travel to and from there home. American missionaries are able to provide training in these locations with a good level of safety .

- ❖ The 10/40 Window is a rectangular shaped area on our globe extending from West Africa to East Asia, from 10 degrees to 40 degrees north of the equator. Nearly 5.3 billion people live here, including more than 80 percent of the world's poorest of the poor. The 10/40 Window also encompasses the majority of the world's Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists and animists.
- ❖ Within the 10/40 Window 95% are completely unevangelized (will likely die without ever hearing the good news of the Gospel).
- ❖ The great imbalance of missions is the fact that most missionaries and support are sent to reached regions where the Church already exists and the name of Jesus is known. Of foreign mission funding: 87% goes for work among those already Christian. 12% for work among non-Christian that have heard the gospel. However only 1% goes for work among those who do not have access to hear the gospel.
- ❖ In the last 40 years, over 1 billion people have died who have never heard of Jesus, and around 30 million people this year will perish without hearing the message of salvation. Approximately 2 out of 5 people in our world have never heard of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- ❖ 70,000+ people die every day in the unreached world without Jesus.

So, the world may know He is God; a church for everyone.

What is a Rope Holder

“I thank my God...For your fellowship [partnership] in the gospel from the first day until now” (Philippians 1:3- 5). Those of you that hold the rope are really the unsung heroes of this generation. Prayers and support like yours will enabled ICE to reach the unreached, aid the persecuted, and plant churches where there are none.

The concept of rope-holders is 200 years old and was a genuine appeal by William Carey – known as the father of modern missions. As he boarded the ship to India, he turned to his friends and compared missions to a person being lowered into a cave on a rescue mission. Then Carey made a heartfelt appeal: “I will go, but please hold the rope.” His friends took up the challenge and prayed, assisted, and supported Carey for years. Their rope-holding effort enabled Carey to be powerfully used of the Lord in foreign lands .



Church planting / the great commission work is a partnership. We cannot fulfill the Great Commission without someone going, and they cannot go unless we send them. Paul wrote, “How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent?” (Romans 10 14:15)

God called Paul and Barnabas to church planting as they served in the church at Antioch (Acts 13:1-2). What was the response of the church? “And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their hands on them, they sent them away” (Acts 13:3). Fasting. Praying. Sending. Going. That’s what it takes!
