PASTOR'S PEN

The Christmas tree has been an essential decoration of the Christmas season for the last two centuries. Even a thousand years after the crucifixion of Christ, most of those living in what is now Scandinavia endured brutal winters. The Vikings found hope and strength in the evergreen tree. Having a tree in the house was said to bring the gift of strength to life through the worst stretches of winter.

In the seventh Century, St. Boniface, a monk from England said that the evergreen was the tree of life. He said, that even winter could not kill the tree and stood

for the eternal life offered in Christ. Furthermore, he pointed out the triangular shape of the tree noting each point represents the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Legend has it that Martin Luther was walking home on a December evening as was struck by the beauty of the starlight coming through the branches of the many fir trees in the woods. When he got home, he began to attach candles to the tree. Luther taught that the tree represented the everlasting love of God. He pointed out that the color of the tree does not fade, just like the Lord's love never fades, no matter what the circumstances. The candlelight represented the hope that Christ brought to the world through his birth and resurrection.

The Blue Christmas, a Service of Hope for the Holidays, pays attention to the special needs of people who are "blue", sad or in pain at this holiday time. Local churches are combining efforts to hold this service at Holy Spirit Lutheran Church, Secane on December 21, 2023, at 7:00 pm.

Sometimes these services are called *Longest Night Services*, recognizing that the private night hours are often the most difficult, and the longest night of the year takes place on the winter solstice — this year on December 21. This service blends elements of Christmas worship and the hope that Jesus can give to people who are in pain. This service is open to any individual or family that might find it helpful during the challenging holiday season.

December brings the Advent season and the Christmas miracle when God sent his Son, born in a manger to Mary & Joseph, who would grow to ultimately die for our sins and be raised again on Easter morning. This was the greatest gift ever---the Forgiveness of Sin though Grace----and the promise of Eternal Life for Us! As we all reflect on our lives and blessings, we need to remember that everything we have came from God's awesome generosity. How will we show our generosity and what will we do with our Time, Talents and Treasure to allow Immanuel's Mission to continue?




