The Member Appreciation Dinner and Rally had to be moved because of horrible weather and has been







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Between the Cones

s some of you may know, I went two years without my car; a 1984

Porsche 928S. I have owned that car for about sixteen years and the drivetrain was original so I decided to do a total drivetrain swap. I was also going to do the engine, because it was old, worn down and it leaked everything.

I looked for a long block for my car on the internet and was able to find one for a really good deal. I jumped on it and bought it. When I got the engine, the description on it said "ready to go as is just drop in and plug it in and start driving it". I thought that's good but I might want to see what some of the insides looked like. I started tearing it down looking at the inside parts like the bearings. When I took one of the heads off I noticed that inside the cylinders was water but not your normal water. It smelled like either river water or sewer water (hard to tell the difference).

After more examination and telling my dad what I found, we both thought that it would be a good idea to just go ahead and rebuild the whole thing. I ordered a complete seal kit from a company out of California that specializes only with 928's. After I ordered the kit and some other parts for the engine, I broke the engine down to just the block so I could

clean and degrease it. Once it was as clean as I could get it, I painted it with some high temp aluminum looking paint. After the block was painted and the heads were back from the head shop, I painted and lapped the valves. I started putting it all back together with new gaskets, seals, and new paint.

Once I finished putting it together, I was about to put it in the car and some personal things happened. I had to put off doing an engine swap. After I moved down to Oklahoma from Indiana, I thought it was time to do a full drivetrain swap with the newly rebuild engine. I also decided to do the torque tube and transmission.

I took the car back to Indiana where my parents are living and asked my dad if he could work on it. I went up there when I could to help. After two years of working on it, we finally had it done. I flew up to Indiana to pick up the car. On the drive back to Oklahoma, I noticed that I was having trouble with the cooling system. A couple of months later, I drove the car back up to Indiana to upgrade the cooling fans from the belt driven fan to the electric one that come on the later model 928's. We thought it would be a one day job to wire the fans in. After a few problems and re-engineering, we had the fans in and working automatically when the car gets hot.

Now that I have all of that done, the car drives and handles likes new. I love the car but I have come to a decision that I would like to have a newer model 928 and a 5-speed as well. I'm hoping that when I sell it, it goes to a good home and they enjoy it as much as I have. I'm looking forward to my next adventure with another Porsche.






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


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
