

Composer: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

(January 27th, 1756 - December 5th, 1791)

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born in Salzburg, Austria in 1756. He was **named after** his grandfather on his mother's side. When he was three years old he learned to play the piano. By the age of five, he **made up** his own minuets. He and his father **set out** on a tour of Europe and played for Louis XV at Versailles.

Mozart was **brought up** to be a Roman Catholic and remained a loyal member of the Catholic Church throughout his life. In 1782, Mozart married Constanze Weber. In Vienna, Mozart **took care of** his family financially by performing in public, private, teaching and composing. Mozart was known throughout Europe. In 1790, Mozart **turned down** an opportunity to compose in London.

While composing for the Vienna court, Mozart **came down with** rheumatic fever. He never **got over** his illness and **passed away** in December 1791.


