#### **Lesson from The Coffee bean:**

It starts with a seed in the Sun, shining on it. And when the rain falls, It takes about 3 to 5 years for crops to grow. Similar to a lost soul. In order to get them to Jesus, it takes an investment of time and sharing. You must invest in someone. With the care of the farmer, the beans are harvested at just the right time. Hand pick usually one time a year. A good picker averages approximately a hundred to 2 hundred pounds of coffee cherries a day, which will produce thirty to forty pounds of beans. Evangelism involves ongoing effort. The more we share, the more love we show of Jesus, the more time we give. There will be a crop produced. The fruit may not be in large quantities, maybe small numbers. It's not the number of prayers we get people to say, it's the change that matters. Once the cherries are picked, processing the cherries must start as soon as possible, so they don't spoil. The same with us as a new soul comes to the Lord. It is important to begin discipleship right away so that the enemy doesn't come and Snatch them away. So they can learn to be strong and effective in service to our lord. Coffee is processed in 1 of 2 ways. The dry method is the old method of processing coffee. The freshly picked cherries are simply spread out on a huge surface to dry in the sun. In order to prevent the cherries from spoiling, they are raked and turned throughout the day. We see that there is an investment of

time, energy and effort. The same is true when we are discipled. When we are building a relationship and when we are showing Christ to others, it takes physical involvement. The cherries are covered at night to prevent them from getting wet. This process takes several weeks with each batch of coffee until the moisture content of the cherry's drops to 11%. just as our involvement with those who have accepted Jesus in their savior should continue. So that they can mature and become more like Christ and less like the world. So the things of the world will drop away. But their love for Christ will grow along with their obedience to Christ. So they look more like him than the world. The second method is called the wet method. The idea is, there is more than one way to prepare the beans. The same as bringing someone to Christ. There are lots of different kinds of evangelistic tools out there. The best result for one, Is getting personally involved with people by sharing your story, by hearing their story and telling His story. Next in coffee bean production is the milling process. The hulls are removed from the dry husk, grading and sorting for size and weight of the beans, and also reviewing the color and flaws and other imperfections. Beans are seized by passing through a series of screens. Testing is important. By testing, we increase our faith in God by testing, we increase our dependence upon God and what we see Is the sincerity of one's heart. It is never good to send somebody out who isn't ready for the responsibility or calling of God in their life. It takes time to prepare them to work with them and sort out their gifts, That God has given them! At this point they are ready to go out into the world where they will be heated by fire and tested. So their flavor and love come out for the person who they are sharing with. What about you, what kind of flavor are you giving off? Remember it is what comes out of you that draws people to you or chases them off. May what comes out of you be the light of the Lord! The Love of the Lord! The forgiveness of the Lord!

"Money," said another. "A safe place," a boy said thoughtfully. Then one girl spoke up: "hope," " Hope is expecting good things to happen," she explained. I find it interesting that she talked about "Expecting" good things when, due to challenges, It can be easy not to expect good things in life.
