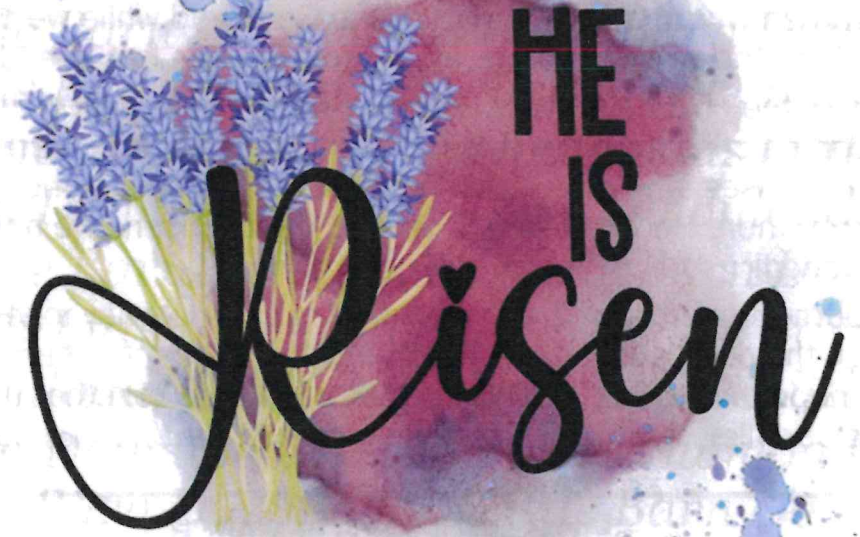

We are almost here. We are almost in the garden where they laid our Lord. We are almost in the moment when we can cry together “He is risen, He is risen indeed!”

But we are not quite there, yet. We are entering the city waving palm branches, seeing the one who is our Lord, the Messiah. We are crying Hosanna with great joy...

We held our annual budget meeting on February 26th and the 2023 Budget was unanimously approved. Thank you to John Van Veen and Curtis Leseman and the Board for all the work to prepare the budget. Our 2023 Stewardship Campaign, "Our Church, Our Community, Our Responsibility" has had a very successful start, and we thank all who turned in your card. For anyone who did not, it's not too late and we really need everyone's contributions. But as the budget stands, we will need to borrow \$84,300 from our endowment, so please send your estimate of giving card to the church office asap. Thank You!

THE SYMBOLS IN OUR SANCTUARY

Last month we started a series about the symbols in our Sanctuary, and we continue it this month noting that the eight small windows in the balcony of the Sanctuary are all symbols of Christ:

- 1) *I am the Door*, John 10:9; symbolic of our Savior,
- 2) *I am the Vine*, John 15:1; the branches represent his followers, a symbol that is often seen in wood carvings and paintings,
- 3) *The Fish*; a secret sign used by early Christians to identify each other, and keep from exposing themselves to the foes of Christianity,
- 4) *The Good Shepherd*, John 10:11; symbol of Jesus Christ, who laid down His life for His flock;
- 5) *I am the Way*, John 14:6; symbol of Christ's leadership;
- 6) *I am the Light*, John 8:12; signifying that Christ's followers will enjoy the light of life;
- 7) *The Bread of Life*, John 6:35; signifying that Christ satisfies our spiritual hunger;
- 8) *The Crown*, representing Jesus as Lord and King, as suggested in 1 Peter 5:4, "And when the chief Shepherd is manifested you will obtain the unfading crown of glory."

Next month the Stain Glass Windows at the front of the Sanctuary will be featured. That will conclude the *Symbols in our Sanctuary* series. Please let the office know if there are subject matters that you could suggest that might be of interest to our members and friends of our church. Please know we will always welcome your thoughts and ideas. Thank you.

HOLY WEEK AT CHURCH OF THE CHIMES



Sunday, April 2: Palm Sunday

We will have palms! We hear of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and will also share the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. After worship will be a prayer walk as we begin our journey to the cross and empty tomb.



Tuesday, April 4: Brown Bag Bible (noon in Dreier Hall)

It was on a Tuesday that You spoke out against abuse of power Collaboration with the oppressor, and misuse of authority. Our Bible Study will look at each day of Jesus' last week as well as the Scripture for Easter Sunday.



Thursday, April 6: Maundy (means "commandment") Thursday

On Maundy Thursday, so named for the "mandate" Jesus gave to His followers to love and serve each other, they shared the last supper in the upper room. On this day, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. There will be special music, and as the sanctuary darkens, we hear words of the betrayal and the arrest of our Lord. The service ends in darkness, and we will leave silently bearing the sorrow of that night.



Good Friday, April 7: At noon we will meet in the Chapel to hear the last words of Christ from the cross; we will have periods of silence to reflect upon the crucifixion and sacrifice of our Lord.

Saturday, April 8: On this day called "Silent Saturday", the day after Jesus was crucified, His body lay in the Tomb. Those who loved and followed Him, spent the day filled with crushing grief, confusion, and doubt.



Sunday, April 9 ALLELUIA! CHRIST HAS RISEN

7 a.m. Sunrise service in the garden to hear the story of Christ rising from the dead. After the service there will be a light potluck breakfast in Dreier Hall.

10:30 a.m. SANCTUARY SERVICE OF REJOICING! We will have very special music, and we will hear the amazing story of Christ's resurrection.
