CONGRATULATIONS TO THESE OUTSTANDING COACHES

Paul Ten Eyck for his selection into the Michigan High School Coaches Association Hall of Fame. He coached both boys and girls golf at Forest Hills Central for 33 years. His boys golf team were 8x League Champions, 3x District Champions, 8x Regional Champions. At the State Finals his teams finished Runner-Up once and he won a State Championship. His coaching record was 2,967-722. On the individual side, Coach Ten Eyck had a State Champion, a State Runner-Up and 11 All State Selections. One of his players went on to win 2 NCAA Championships. He also has achieved numerous coaching honors as he was the Regional Coach of the Year 3x, State Coach of the Year, Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA) Coach of the Year along with the National Federation of High Schools Section Coach of the Year. He is in the MIGCA Hall of Fame and the Forest Hills Central Hall of Fame. Coach Ten Eyck also has provided great service as he was a MIGCA Board member for many years and also the President of the MIGCA along with being an MIGCA liaison to the MHSAA for 5 years.

Dan Stolz for his selection into the National High School Athletic Coaches Hall of Fame. Dan has had a tremendous coaching career across many sports and achieved success at the highest level. His high school golf accomplishments are listed later in this book as he has been selected as the 2025 MIGCA Girls Coach of the Year also.

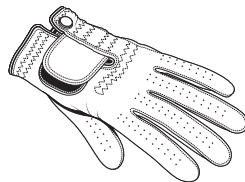

Kate Schultz of Northville is our 2024 Division 1 Girls Coach of the Year! Northville was undefeated in the Kensington Lakes Athletic Association, winning its fifth conference championship in six years, and capturing the top 5 individual all-conference spots. The Mustangs featured a young roster of one senior, two juniors, one sophomore and two freshmen, but shot 319 at their Regional Tournament to win by 39 shots, and then took the State Championship by an impressive 18 shots. "I am truly touched to receive the honor of Division 1 Coach of the Year from my fellow members in the association," Schultz said. "I'm humbled and couldn't have done it without my co-coach Trish Murray and my wonderful golfers and their families. It is truly an honor, thank you." Schultz credits her mentor Trish Murray who coached Northville when Schultz played more than 20 years ago. As a player, Schultz was D1 State Medalist in 2002, and went on to play at Grand Valley State University. Greg Palkowski of Dexter is our 2024 Division 2 Girls Coach of the Year. Dexter finished runner-up at the Division 2 State Finals at The Meadows at Grand Valley State University, its best finish since winning the title in 2007. Dexter junior Avery Manning was medalist at the State Finals, earning a spot on the MIGCA Super Team. The Dreadnaughts were undefeated in Southeastern Conference Red Division play with three players earning All-Conference honors. Dexter won the East Jackson Invitational at Calderone Golf Club, and the Jackson Area Invite at Cascades Golf Course. They also captured their first Regional Title since 2009, shooting 341 at Coldwater Golf Course. In his 5th season as head coach, "Coach P" spent five years as girls' assistant coach and also coaches the boys' team. He was also selected SEC Red Division Coach of the Year, and Region 10 Coach of the Year. Coach P lives in Dexter with his wife, Kelly, and daughter, Lauren, a junior at Dexter High School. His daughter Courtney graduated from Michigan State University in 2022. Greg has worked 16 years as the Business and Finance Director at Daycroft School in Ann Arbor. "Thank you so much for this tremendous honor," Palkowski said. "There are so many deserving coaches, and to be recognized by my peers as Division 2 Coach of the Year is truly special. "This award is a tribute to everyone who has helped me along the way. Thank you to the game of golf - it has been an integral part of my life for a long time.

He is a member of the MIGCA Hall of Fame and Executive Board. This year the Cardinals won the Central State Activities Association championship, their 13th title in the past 16 years. They went on to finish 3rd at their Regional Tournament and finished 11th at the State Finals at The Meadows at Grand Valley State University.

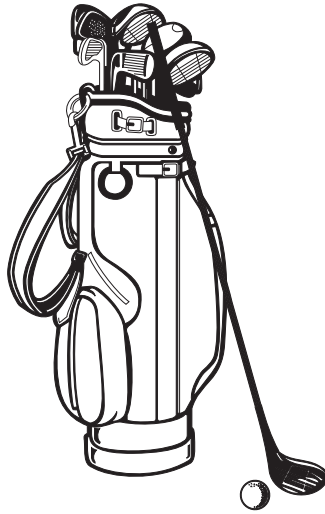

Okemos

Dan Stolz of Okemos has been named the overall 2024 Girls Coach of the Year by the Michigan Interscholastic Golf Coaches Association. "I'm extremely honored and grateful to receive this prestigious award," Stolz said. "It's definitely a result of the efforts of my outstanding assistant coaches and our hard working athletes. I'm thankful and blessed beyond measure." Stolz's young team of three freshmen, two sophomores and one senior won its 14th consecutive Capital Area Athletic Conference Blue Division championship and finished 5th at the MHSAA Lower Peninsula Division 1 State Finals at Katke Golf Course in Big Rapids. The Wolves won five tournaments and finished 2nd at the Region 6 Tournament at Forest Akers East Golf Course in East Lansing. In 16 years with Stolz at the helm, Okemos has nine top 5 finishes at the State Finals, and six Regional championships. Stolz has coached three MIGCA Miss Golf recipients, and six State Finals medalists. He was named Regional Coach of the Year in 2013, 2018, and 2024, and was Division 2 Coach of the Year in 2020.

Stolz's coaching accolades are not confined to just golf. He was named Class A Girls Tennis Coach of the Year in 1993, Division 1 Girls Softball Coach of the Year in 1999, and Boys Basketball Class A and Overall Coach of the Year in 2006 by the Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan in 2006.

Stolz was inducted into the Alma College Athletics Hall of Fame in 1996, the Okemos High School Athletic Hall of Fame in 2015, the Greater Lansing Area Sports Hall of Fame in 2017, the Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame in 2019, and next year

Charlevoix

We are excited to announce that Charlevoix High School's Doug Drenth is our overall 2025 Boys Golf Coach of the Year.

MIGCA members voted on our Divisional Coaches of the Year, and the MIGCA Executive Board was tasked with selecting one coach who stood out among all. Frankly, this year it was not a difficult decision. Not that we didn't have a huge selection of dedicated and amazing coaches, but rather because Doug Drenth demonstrated to all of us how to fulfill our most-important duty of protecting the student-athletes entrusted to our care.

Every day of fall and spring golf seasons, in every corner of the Lower and Upper Peninsulas, parents of high school golfers watch their children climb into school vans driven by their coaches trusting their children will return home safely. Amazingly, 99.9 percent of the time, they do.



However, no one can anticipate when something awful might happen, as it did on the evening of April 27 on M-115 in Benzie County.

According to police reports, the driver of a stolen vehicle fleeing police crossed the centerline and drove into a school van carrying seven Charlevoix high school golfers driven by Coach Drenth after an event at Arcadia Bluffs Golf Course.

Charlevoix senior Jackson Crouse was sitting in the front passenger seat next to Coach Drenth.

"I saw everything unfold and one thing I know is our coach is a hero who saved lives Sunday with his quick response," Jackson told the Traverse City Record-Eagle." He turned that van to the right to put himself between the oncoming vehicle and his team behind him."

Coach Drenth took the brunt of the impact. He was unconscious for two days and hospitalized for nearly 6 weeks. He is currently at home recovering from his many, severe injuries. The teenagers in his care fared much better. Three walked away with little more than bumps and bruises; four boys had a variety of more-severe injuries, some requiring surgery.

Most of the boys returned to the course by season's end. Coach Drenth's injuries will take more time to heal after intentionally, or instinctively, putting himself in harm's way to save his kids.

Coaches across the state collectively thought "It could have been me and my team." We wondered "How might I have responded in that situation?" Thankfully, most of us will never have to find out.

Coach Drenth is a retired Charlevoix educator and administrator who has dedicated more than 30 years to educating kids. In addition to coaching golf for 8 years, he is a longtime cross country coach at Charlevoix, and currently works as clubhouse manager at Charlevoix Golf Club.

A written statement provided to MIGCA from Charlevoix Superintendent Mike Ritter, Athletic Director Alex Tiseo, Assistant Principal Travis Garrett and Principal Dan Terryberry reads, in part:

"(Doug Drenth's) leadership, integrity, and unwavering commitment to student-athletes continue to leave a lasting impact on our school and community.

"This past spring, during a tragic accident involving members of his golf team, Doug acted with extraordinary courage and care to protect his students. His selfless actions and continued strength during recovery have inspired us all.



"Even through adversity, Doug remains a guiding light for his team and a true example of resilience and dedication. His impact reaches far beyond the game; he is a role model for our entire district and community.

"We appreciate the MIGCA recognizing Coach Doug for his lifelong contributions to student-athletes and the game of golf in Michigan."

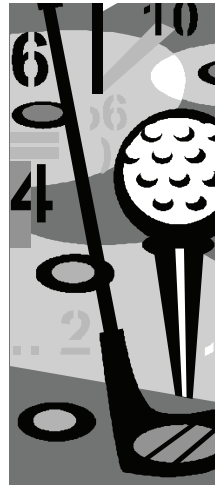

Petoskey High School

Chad Loe has coached golf at Petoskey High School for the past twenty-five years, for a combined twenty-nine seasons of coaching golf, 25 seasons of boys and four seasons of girls at Petoskey High School. During those years his teams played in 325 tournaments, winning 23 with the boys and 14 with the girls. They finished 2nd, 51 times, and 3rd or 4th, 76 times. The boys team won four MHSAA District, a Regional Championship in 2014 and qualified a team or individual for nine MHSAA State Championship tournaments. The girls team won the Big North Conference Championship along with a Regional Championship in 2024, and qualified three teams for the MHSAA State Championships. Chad has received several coaching honors during his coaching years, that include: MIGCA Boys District Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2014; Boys Regional Coach of the year in 2014 and the MIGCA Division II Boys Coach of the Year in 2015. He also was the MIGCA Girls Regional Coach of the Year in 2023. He has been an active member of the MIGCA all 25 years of his coaching career, has hosted numerous Invationals, hosted MHSAA District and Regionals, has been on the MIGCA All-State selection committee and has been on the MHSAA Golf Committee for several years. During the summer months he helps with junior golf in the Petoskey area and started Up-North Junior Golf in 2007. He also assisted coaching basketball and soccer in Petoskey for several years. Rob McIntyre

Grosse Pointe South High School

Rob McIntyre coached golf at Grosse Pointe South for twenty seasons of boys and three seasons of girls beginning in the early 2000's. During those seasons his teams were very successful with a boy's dual match record of 92-12 and a girls record of 15-1 while his teams played in 139 tournaments, finishing in the top three numerous times. His team won the Boys Macomb Area Conference Red Championship ten times and the Girl's championship two times. The boys won four MHSAA District and three Regional Championships, while the girls won Regional Championships in 2018 and 2019. The boys qualified teams or individuals twelve times for the MHSAA State Championship tournament, finishing as Runner-Up in 2017 and 2019, surrounding a Division I Boys State Championship in 2018. The girls' team was the State Championship Runner-Up in 2019. Rob has received several golf coaching honors over the years: MAC Red Conference Coach of the Year five times; MIGCA Boys District Coach of the Year in 2011, Boys Regional Coach of the Year in 2010, 2014, 2018 and 2023 and the MIGCA Division I Boys Coach of the Year in 2018. He was also MAC Red Conference Girls Coach of the Year as well as the MIGCA Division I Girls Coach of the Year in 2019. He hosted The Blue Devil Invitational for many years and as a longtime member of the MIGCA, participated in the All-State selection for both boys and girls. Rob and his wife Amy live in Grosse Pointe Woods and have twin daughters, Alexandra and Morgan.

Martha Ryan

Grand Blanc High School

Martha Ryan was the Girls Golf Coach at Grand Blanc High School from 1999 to 2008. During her short eleven season she created one of the most impressive resumes in golf coaching! Her teams had a dual match record of 161-16, and played in forty invitational tournaments, winning 16 times and finishing 2nd or 3rd, eleven times. The Grand Blanc girls won eight Big 9 Conference Championships and won a total of eight MHSAA Division I Regional Championships over Martha's eleven years as the Head Coach, with all eleven of her teams qualifying for the MHSAA State Championship tournament. Out of the eleven years the Grand Blanc girls finished as State Runner-Up in 2003 and 2007 and won five MHSAA Division I Girls State Championships in 2000, 2004, 2005, 2006 and the Fall of 2007. Martha received recognition for her coaching by receiving the MIGCA Regional Coach of the Year in 2003, the MIGCA Girls Coach of the Year (for all Divisions) in 2006 and was selected as the NFHS National Girls Golf Coach of the Year in 2006. She has been a very active with non-coaching golf activities over the years as well, with fundraising and as President of her Ladies Golf Associations at both Warwick Hills Country Club and Long

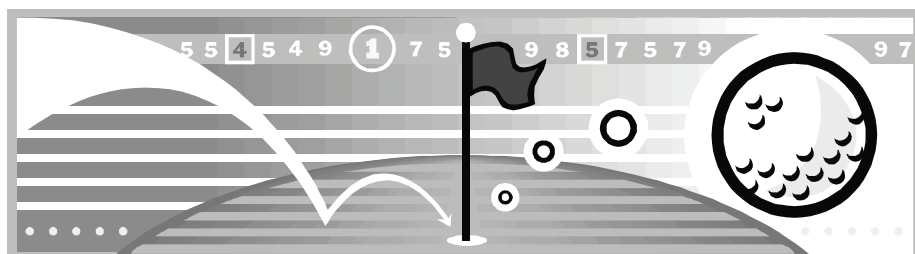

The Lakeland Girls Teams won the Kensington Valley Conference Championship in 2005, the Kensington Lakes Activities Association Championship in 2010 and the MHSAA Division II Girls Regional Championship in 2001. His team or an individual qualified for six MHSAA State Championship tournaments, the last in 2017. Tom was recognized as the Oakland County Division II Girls Golf Coach of the Year in both 2016 and 2018, was the MIGCA Girls Regional Coach of The Year in 2020 and was inducted into the Lakeland High School Hall of Fame in 2023. He hosted numerous varsity and junior varsity tournaments over the years and hosted the MHSAA Girls Regional Tournament as well. As a member of the MIGCA he participated in the Girls All State selection. He has also coached Football, Track, Baseball, Softball, Soccer and Basketball.
