I'm deeply honored to be named the 2022 MIGCA Girls Division I Coach of the Year. I spent 4 years as the Adams JV coach before becoming the Varsity coach 6 seasons ago. I have been blessed with student-athletes who work hard in the classroom and put in time in the off season as much or more than they do during the season. It has truly been an honor to be a part of the Adams program. 2022 was a special season for the Adams Highlanders. We won our 4th consecutive OAA league title (2019,20,21,22). During that 4-year stretch Adams was 20-0 in league matches and took 1st place in all 17 league tournaments played. In 2022 we won the first ever Oakland County title in Adams Girls Golf history. We also captured our 3rd straight regional title (2020,21,22). After finishing 7th in 2019, 2nd in 2020, and 7th in 2021, at state finals the girls had one goal in mind, Win it! The team was able to accomplish this goal at Bedford Valley with a 47-stroke margin of victory as Adams Girls Golf won its first ever State Championship! On top of all of this in 2022 the Adams girls golf team was named an Academic All-State team for the 6th straight year. Thanks goes out to the MIGCA, MHSAA, and OAA for providing these female athletes a chance to perform. More thanks go to the entire staff at Adams for always going above and beyond to make the season possible. A huge thanks to my assistant coach Bob Koltvedt and JV coach Fran Scislowicz for all the support through the years. The parents at Adams are second to none and the support they provide is immeasurable. The biggest thanks of all goes to the Adams girls golf team members for all the hard work and dedication to the team! I could not have asked for a better group of student athletes to work with.

Vicky has coached the Mercy team since the beginning in 1980. The 2022 season culminated in the third State Championship (the others were 1999 and 2001) for Mercy in the 45th season. Mercy began the season as the top Division 2 team at the 2-day Traverse City Central Tournament at Crystal Mountain. Mercy continued the excellent season with top 10 finishes in all tournaments including a new school record 311 score in winning the Farmington Tournament at Glen Oaks. The team was undefeated in dual meet play winning the Catholic League Bishop Division Championship.

I have been coaching golf for 15 years. Thank you to my wife Caryn who allows me to do what I love. During that time I've learned a lot from other members of MIGCA. I consider two to be true mentors. Long time Hall of Fame member Jim Bennett and one of our most recent inductees, Steve Burke. They taught me the things that a golf coach needs to know that has nothing to do with the game itself. Thank you, gentlemen, for your time and patience. It has brought me great success. I have been honored with league, district, regional and division coach of the year recognition 9 times. I have been fortunate to have been to the State Championship 16 straight seasons with both boys and girls. For the 2022 girls' season as a team, we had an overall record of 135 wins to 23 losses. We only had one league loss, to repeat as Huron League Champions. We won 6 tournaments, including repeating as regional champions. We took a third at States. Individually we had 4 tournament medalists (thank you Lily), 5 other top ten finishes and 21 top 20 finishers. All six starters earned All-League honors and 2 were top five at regionals. Captain Lily Bargamian was second at states. They were All State and All State Honorable Mention and Academic All-State. They are one of the finest groups of young women I have had the fortune to coach.

The girls golf team had an exceptional season. They played in ten 18 hole events, with six wins, two 2nds and two 3rds. They finished the regular season by winning their league championship with a score of 326. They went on to win the Regional and State Championships.

Two members of the team were named 1st team All-State and two were named Honorable Mention. The team was also 1st team Academic All-State.

I've been involved with both the boys and girls golf teams for the past 50 years, 38 of them as the head coach of the boys team and 15 of them as head coach of the girls team. As head coach the teams have recorded the following:

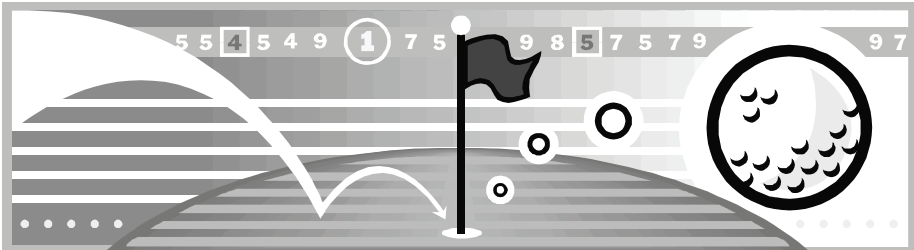
James Dewling

Brighton

A former four-year varsity player at Brighton High School and MIGCA SuperTeam Member., James Dewling has always loved high school team golf. In 2014, he was hired by his former high school Coach to assist at Brighton High School. James has now completed 11 seasons of Coaching, including two seasons as Brighton' Boy's Assistant, two seasons as a Brighton's Girls Assistant, two seasons at Detroit Catholic Central, and returned to his alma mater, Brighton High School, in 2017. James has Coached two Division 1 Team State Championship Teams and three Division 1 Individual State Champions during his continued high school coaching career.

This past season, the Brighton High School team had a historic season, breaking and setting many school records, arguably ranking as one of the best in school history. For the first time in school history, the team had 5 players, average under 80. The team won their first Conference Championship since 2008, shooting two-day scores of 294 and 293. For the season, the team averaged 299, playing one of the most demanding schedules of any team. Additionally, the graduating seniors played in 3 straight State Finals, a feat Brighton had not accomplished since the early 1990s. Brighton finished 3rd at the State Finals for the second straight season, setting a school record for back-to-back finishes.

James is grateful to the Coaches that made his high school golf experience some of the best memories of his life. He continues to strive to give back like those before him have. He is honored to be recognized by his peers, some of whom he played against and now coaches with.



Division II

Kevin Broene

Grand Rapids Christian

Kevin Broene has been coached in various capacities for the past 18 years of his educational career. He coached basketball for twelve years, and also served as an assistant golf coach for ten. He coached girls varsity golf for two years before eventually taking over the varsity boys golf program in 2021. Kevin was named Regional Athletic Director of the year 2018 and Boys Golf Regional Coach of the Year in 2021.

Kevin feels fortunate to be a part of these young people's lives as they learn about life through the game of golf. "It is a privilege to be a small but hopefully impactful part these young men's lives while they play golf at Grand Rapids Christian. I'm honored to walk alongside these boys each day as we learn how the lessons gained through the game of golf can make a difference, not only in our lives, but in the lives of others for decades to come."

The past three seasons have been an incredible start to a boys varsity coaching career. In 2021, Grand Rapids Christian's top five players included four freshman and one sophomore, led by a varsity coach who had never coached a boys high school golf match. This season, those same five players finished the season as State Champions!

The team also earned Academic All-State and won fifteen tournaments, including a second consecutive OK White Conference Championship and a second consecutive Regional Championship, and for the second time in school history, a State Championship.

Not only was the team talented at the top, they were deep. The Eagles had six players average between 37.4 and 38.4. The only senior, Alex VandenBerge (the 7th scorer) is off to fulfill a dream of playing college golf. Twice they entered two teams in the same event and placed 1st and 2nd. One time they entered their top five players in an event at Ann Arbor Skyline's event at The Polo Fields and won, while on the same day five other players competed and won Hillsdale Academy's event at the Medalist.

This year's team was historic at Grand Raids Christian and in the state, placing five players on first team All-State, and one additional player as honorable mention All-State. All six of those players were also 1st Team All-Conference.

As a coach, Kevin knows that any honor he is fortunate to receive is due to the players who play the game and the parents who support them. Kevin wants to thank the players, parents, and administration that allow him to coach. He also wants to thank the MIGCA for this honor, and all the coaches, especially Ken Bokhoven and the coaches of the OK White, who have helped him learn the game. Finally, and most importantly, he is thankful for his wife, Stephanie, who encouraged him to interview for this job three years ago.



Division III

Matt Golzynski

Lansing Catholic

I have been a teacher at Lansing Catholic for the past 10 years and involved coaching the boys golf team for the last 8 years including the last 3 years as the head coach. I also have been the boys tennis coach for the last 6 years.

Since taking over as the head coach 3 years ago, the Cougars have won 2 league titles, 2 regional titles, and had many top ten team performances keeping pace with the tradition that has been established in the boys golf program over the years at Lansing Catholic. This season was no exception with winning the CAAC White boys championship, the Region 17 championship, and being the Runner-Up at the D3 State Championship. The Cougars had 5 top ten finishes this season and numerous medalists and top ten individual finishes in many events this season including the top 4 individual finishers in the CAAC Conference.

Winning the Coach of the Year award is a humbling experience and is something that I share with all of my players, coaches, parents, and especially my wife and kids for allowing me to be part of the lives of the boys that he coaches. This is an amazing honor and I am very appreciative of the honor. I look forward to continuing the amazing success that the Lansing Catholic boys golf program has achieved.

Ann Serra-Lowney

When Ann Serra-Lowney started her coaching career 34 years ago, she never envisioned that one day she would be coaching a boy's golf team. But after the 2019 golf season, long time EC golf coach, Dave Smith said he needed to step down as Everest Collegiates Head Coach. As the schools AD, Ann knew she wasn't ready to lose such a talented coach and an amazing mentor for the boys, so she suggests to Dave, that she would take over the title of head coach and all of the responsibilities that went with it, if he would stay on as an assistant coach, continue to work with the boys and help her learn what was needed to be a successful high school golf coach. Luckily for the boys on the golf team and Ann, Dave agreed to continue to be a part of the program and the success the team has had since Ann took over the head coaching role is in large part to Dave and the culture he created when he took over the EC golf team in 2012. Over the past 7 seasons, the Everest Collegiate Boys golf team has won 5 League titles, 5 Catholic League Titles, 6 Regional Titles, 2 Division 4 State Finalist and 3 Division 4 State Titles. They have also had the Division 4 Individual State champion 3 of the past 4 seasons. When people ask Ann why the team is so successful, she points to these simple facts, "Our boys love to do the following 4 things; 1. they spend time on the putting green, 2. They spend time on short range 3. They hit hundreds of balls on the driving range. And 4. They love to play competitive golf in the off season. Those 4 things give the boys the confidence they need every time they tee it up to have a successful round. As their coach, I can only suggest they do those things, it takes the desire to be successful for them to commit to spending time doing it and I am blessed to coach a group of boys who want to be the best golfers they can be."



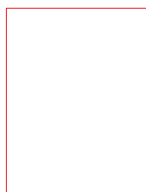


Steve Burk has coached golf for 29 years for a combined 38 seasons of boys and girls golf. He began as the boys golf coach at Southfield Christian from 1989 to 1998 and then went to Trenton in 2003 where he coached boys for nineteen seasons and girls for nine. His teams had an impressive dual match record of 250 wins and only 12 losses. His boys team won thirty invitational tournaments, twenty-five conference championships, five MHSAA District and five MHSAA Regional championships and his girls team won seven invitational tournaments and six conference championships. Steve had twenty-four teams and six individuals qualify for the MHSAA State Championship tournaments over the years and in 2004 the Trenton Boys Golf Team won the MHSAA Division II State Championship. Coaching honors have come along the way with Steve being selected as the Oakland County Boys Coach of the Year in 1995, the MIGCA Girls Regional Coach of the year in both 2015 and 2020, the MIGCA Boys Regional Coach of the Year in 2003, 2005, 2013 and 2019 and the MIGCA Boys Division II Coach of the Year in 2005. In addition to golf, Steve has coached boys and girls basketball, baseball, football, track, cross country and volleyball in Hawaii when he first started teaching. Steve and his wife Ronda moved from Trenton to Traverse City in the summer of 2022, after he retired from teaching. They have two sons, Josh and Zac (who is deceased) and two grandchildren.





Randy Johnson started coaching boys golf at Oakland Christian in 1999 and during his 22 seasons has had a very impressive record. His teams overall dual match record was 234 wins, 25 loses and 2 ties. In 85 invitationals, the team won 32 times (winning 38% of the time) and finished 2nd or 3rd in ten other times. They won 13 Conference Championships, five MHSAA Districts Championships and five MHSAA Regional Championships. Nine of Randy's team qualified for the MHSAA State Championships as well as three individuals and in 2011, Oakland Christian won the MHSAA Division IV State Championship and the Oakland County Division I Championship (the only time a Division IV team won the Division I tournament). Randy has been an active member of the MIGCA over the years as part of the All-State Selection Committee, has hosted numerous golf tournaments, has been his leagues chairman for eight years and helped various coaches from other schools develop their golf programs. Randy has been recognized for his coaching by being named Conference Coach of the Year 13 times, Eccentric Coach of the Year in 2011, MIGCA District Coach of the Year six time and MIGCA Regional Coach of the Year four times. He received the Oakland County Coach of the Year in 2011 and was the MIGCA Division IV Coach of the Year in 2011 and 2014. And, in 2014 he was a Finalist for the National Coaches Association Boys Golf Coach of the Year. Randy also has coached boys and girls soccer and boys and girls bowling at Oakland Christian. Dr. Randy Johnson, is currently a pastor and he and his wife, of 40 years, Angela live in Auburn Hills and have two children, Clint and Stephanie and two grandchildren.



Tom Koert has been coaching high school boys and girls golf for 31 seasons, fifteen with the boys and sixteen with the girls. He coached fourteen years at NorthPointe Christian, and for the past few years has been the boys coach at Lowell and the girls coach at Sparta. During his golf coaching seasons his teams have had some impressive records. His boys and girls teams played in 190 tournaments, winning 39 championships and finishing in the top four 105 times. His girls' team won four conference championships, two MHSAA Regional titles and qualified a team or individual thirteen times for the MHSAA State Championships. His boys' team won eight conference championships, five MHSAA District titles, two MHSAA Regionals and qualified the team or individuals ten times for the MHSAA State Championships. Tom has always been an active member of the MIGCA and participated on All-State selection for many years plus attended numerous clinics. He has hosted tournament invitationals, MHSAA District and Regionals, conference championships and



hosted the Kent County Girls Classic. Tom has also been a member of the MHSAA State Golf Committee. In 2015, he took on the West Michigan Junior Golf Tour during the summer months for junior players from the Mid-Michigan area and beyond. And, during the winter months he host and coaches junior golfers indoors for a four month period of time. He has also coached softball, baseball and basketball along the way. Tom and his wife Renee' live in Grand Rapids and have four grown children, John, Meredith, Jackson and Monica and two grandchildren with another due in May 2023.



Nathan Oake has been coaching high school boys golf for twenty-three years at Hartland, Flushing, Britton-Deerfield and Chelsea. During Nathan's coaching his teams have a dual match record of 131 wins against 42 loses, his teams played in 356 tournaments, winning 20 and finishing in the top three a total of 58 times. His teams won twelve KLAAC Conference championships, won four MHSAA District titles and three MHSAA Regional championships. Since 2008, the Hartland boys' team or individuals have qualified twelve times for the MHSAA Division I State Championship Tournament. Nathan has been recognized for his coaching achievements by being selected as MIGCA District Coach of the Year two times, MIGCA Regional Coach of the Year three times, MIGCA overall Boys Coach of the Year in 2015 as well as the National Federation of High School Boys Coach of the Year in Michigan and he was the MIGCA Division I Coach of the Year in 2019. He has been the MIGCA Treasurer for the past ten years, MIGCA All-State selection committee for 18 years, a MHSAA Golf Committee member and a MHSAA District, Regional and State Championship manager several times. Nathan has also been the Michigan National Golf Chairman for the National High School Athletic Coaches Association for three years. He is a PGA Life Member, Founder and Director of the Kensington Junior Golf Tour, a PGA Junior League Captain and has coached youth baseball, football and middle school basketball and track. Nathan and his wife Chasta live in Howell and have two sons Aidan and Colton.
