



Developing Debating Skills – Training for staff

Why?

"Honest disagreement is often a good sign of progress." Mahatma Ghandi

- Debating develops speaking and listening skills
- Speaking in front of an audience builds confidence and self-esteem
- Debating builds critical listening skills and the ability to respond to what other people are saying. Being able to see things from a range of perspectives is a real life skill
- Written work improves as debating helps students understand how to structure their work and make their points clearly.
- Debating helps develop research skills.
- Debating broadens horizons and encourages exploration of big ethical questions.
- It is highly validating for children to be asked for their opinion, and shows them that their thoughts and voice matter
- Recent research from the University of Bedfordshire and the English-Speaking Union revealed that learning to debate can improve children's <u>SATs</u> results by between six and 19 per cent in all subjects.

Objectives

- To provide staff with an understanding of how a formal debate takes place and how to prepare pupils
- To provide strategies in preparing pupils to become effective at debating
- To support staff in helping pupils develop their speaking and listening skills, particularly in response to each other
- To support staff in enabling pupils to develop written skills in presenting an argument and persuasive writing

Course Outline
