Supervisor Koehn opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Roll call was taken of the Board members present: Jim Malarney, Mike Herr, Steve May, Rob Hosken, Jim Koehn and Ray Thompson. Ben Ruesink was absent.

May moved, supported by Malarney, to approve the minutes of the regular Board Meeting held on May 9, 2022 at 7:00 pm. The motion passed unanimously.

Fire Department Report - Distributed

Hosken moved, supported by Herr, to approve the purchase 8 replacement tires for Engine 2 from Horst Tire LLC, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$6,512.00. The motion passed unanimously.

The Chair entertained a motion by May, supported by Thompson, to approve the hourly rate increase of \$.50 for both the Fire personnel and Police Department officers through the end of calendar year 2022, or when gasoline prices drop below \$4.00 / hour. The motion passed unanimously.

Police Department Report –Distributed

Police Chief Hanselman stated that the proposed 30 hours per week applicant was scheduled to be discharged from The Coast Guard active duty at the end of June, has now been extended by the Coast Guard until the end of September.

Chief Hanselman said he has received 2 applications for the Police Chief in addition to the Coast Guard person.

- The Chief also stated that he will now stay on until the end of the year to train his successor.
- The Chief would like to increase Officer Rockette's rate from \$23.00 to \$25.00 per hour. This would keep at the same rate as Officer Meloche
- Malarney moved, supported by Herr, to approve Officer Michael Rockette hourly rate to \$25.00, comparable to Officer Meloche. The motion passed unanimously.

Annual audit has been postponed because they did not attend the meeting

Police chief status was described above.

Ordinance fines will be reviewed by Koehn, Chief Hanselman and Attorney Koselka.

Wolf Creek Pass discussion was held with many of the residents in attendance

- Koehn explained that the residents did not want to turn the road into gravel two years ago.
- Residents stated that they have called the L.C.R.C. more than once to have the potholes filled.
 - o They claim they were told that the road wasn't worth repairing.
 - o All they are asking for the potholes filled in.
- Koehn will attempt to setup a meeting between the residents and the L.C.R.C.

Thompson moved, supported by May, to approve the Chad Whelan PA-116 request regarding 243 acres in sections 7 & 18. The motion passed unanimously.
