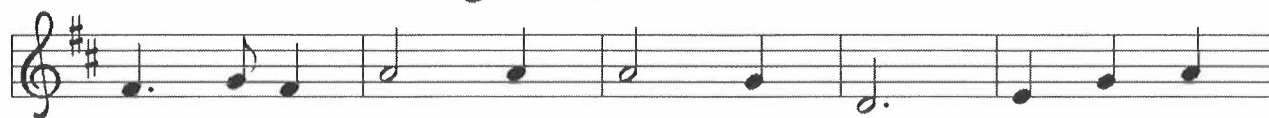
Jesus welcomes you to this table. Come, here is your God.
