

Expansive Language + As Lutherans, we teach that "God calls all creation into being and gives people language as a way of responding to God and forming community" (Principles for Worship, Principle L-1). In worship at Our Saviour's, we seek to use expansive language for God and people, sometimes changing or offering alternatives to the printed text.

Current Liturgy Music + liturgy is the flow of our worship service - working together as people to praise God. Currently our liturgy music is from Evangelical Lutheran Worship and Renewing Worship.

Holy Trinity Sunday

Triune God who is One-in Three and Three-in-One. Our weekly practice includes language such as: "The grace of Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all" (from Paul's letter to the church in Corinth). On this day, we take time to especially lift up our belief in a Triune God.

The readings for Trinity Sunday speak of the Mystery the Church has named as the God Who is Three in One. The book of Proverbs alludes to one called Wisdom, she who is with God from the very beginning of creation. The psalm celebrates the God who is sovereign in and over all creation. Romans asserts love as the binding principle that God and Christ and Spirit pour into the faithful. The gospel of John recalls Jesus' promise of the Spirit to guide the faithful in all truth.

 - ³¹ playing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.



Come to the table of grace. Receive the gift of new life.



SMALL GROUP MINISTRY

You will find (or can create) many ways to get to know others through small group ministry at Our Saviour's. Many of these groups take a pause during the summer because of vacation and travel schedules. This also provides the chance for informal book groups, movie and game nights, public witness, and other great ideas you might have to connect people here or out in the community. **From September to May** we offer vocal and bell choir and a variety of faith formation groups on Sunday mornings and throughout the week. Our young people connect with other Lutheran teens in Tucson through Super Youth. Pastor Mateo and Annette Chavez offer weekly Spanish classes for all levels. **Throughout the year,** you can connect with quilting, prayer shawl groups, our Caring Ministry team that reaches out to those at home or in care centers, and lay-led Bible and prayer groups.
