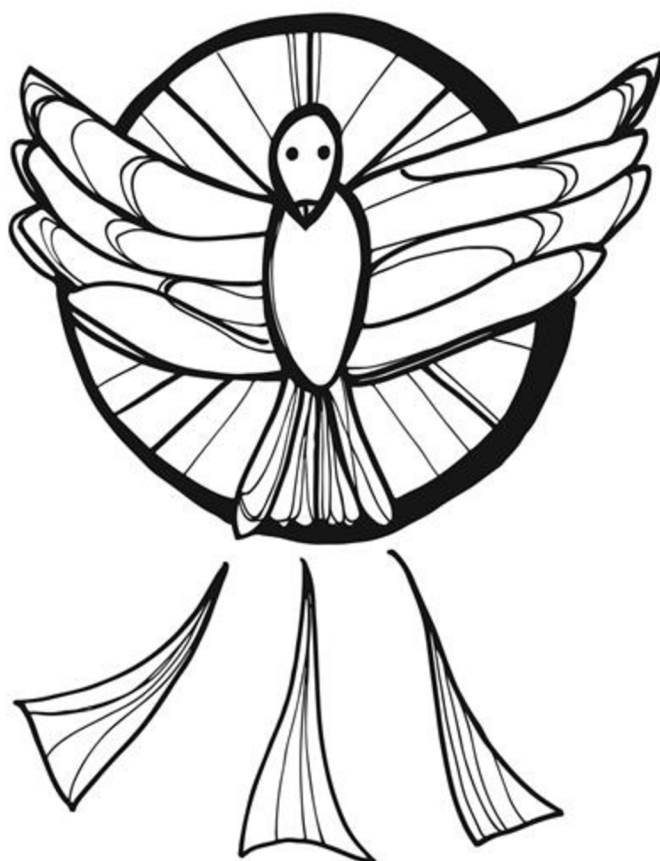

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OVERVIEW OF TODAY’S SCRIPTURE:

This Sunday marks the Church’s observance of the Baptism of Jesus. The lections speak to the meaning of baptism in a variety of ways. Isaiah announces a coming Servant upon whom God will put God’s Spirit for the sake of justice-bringing ministry. The psalm uses imagery of waters and God’s voice to celebrate the reign and power of God. The Book of Acts testifies to the waters of baptism now extended by God to Gentiles. Matthew narrates Jesus’ baptism by John. It is a story of God gifting Jesus with Spirit’s power and relationship-affirming names.

SECOND READING Acts 10:34-43

³⁴ Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵ but in every people anyone who fears him and practices righteousness is acceptable to him. ³⁶ You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷ That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹ We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰ but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹ not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴² He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³ All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."



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
