
OUR SAVIOUR'S LUTHERAN CHURCH SUNDAY WORSHIP

we confess that we have sinned. We have turned away from our neighbors. We have trusted false promises.


God in our midst,

you, the Almighty, have done great things for me and holy is your name. You have mercy on those who fear you, from generation to generation.

You have shown strength with your arm and scattered the proud in their conceit, casting down the mighty from their thrones and lifting up the lowly.

You have filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty. You have come to the aid of your servant Israel, to remember the promise of mercy,

the promise made to our forebears, to Abraham [and Sarah and their] children forever.


SECOND READING: Hebrews 10:5-10

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body you have prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'See, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.






COMMUNION
