

God's assurance comes in Christ's grace that forgives us.


God's assurance comes in Spirit's Presence who accompanies us.

Dialogue

(Revelation 22:1-2)

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month,

and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

*PRAYER OF THE DAY

FIRST READING Isaiah 2:1-5

Isaiah defies reduction to a one-size-fits-all message. Words of judgment and words of hope sound and repeat time and again in close proximity. Context, then and now, dictates which word is appropriate. Isaiah's first chapter spoke harsh judgment, where God finds worship burdensome when justice goes ignored. But in our reading from chapter 2, hope emerges. Its sworn coming bids God's people, then and now, to live this day in the light of God's promised day.

² In days to come the mountain of the Lord's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains and shall be raised above the hills: all the nations shall stream to it. ³ Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob. that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. ⁴ He shall judge between the nations and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation; neither shall they learn war any more. ⁵ O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!


