We hunker down into our places, then emerge blinking and stretching to renew connections as the weather breaks. Like deep winter in Iowa, this month has been a time of generative underground growth. One of the "deep summer" projects I've been working on this past month is preparing for the fall ahead. As part of that work, I'm delighted to announce that Sophia Rankin will begin serving in the new role of Minister of Community Engagement (10 hours/week) on Monday, August 15.

One of the goals we set for this year was to develop new initiatives through family and music ministries to provide comfort, support, and growth for the congregation and to serve the Tucson community. We began with the expansion of our music ministry through the hiring of our new music director, Greta Pasztor (who also begins August 15). Now, we're looking to deepen our ministry with youth and young adults and engage in intergenerational projects to serve our neighborhood and Tucson. As Minister of Community Engagement, Sophia will engage the congregation in building long-term relationships with one another in ways that intersect with our neighbors' interests and needs. She will work across the generations, intentionally focusing some of her time on youth and young adults. She will also help explore and support regular all-ages activities that serve our neighboring communities. She will continue to be a regular presence in our music ministry. Sophia has been an important part of our worship life since 2016, stepping up this past year to serve as music ministry coordinator. I've come to appreciate the many gifts Sophia offers for leadership and community engagement. With some funds available due to Pastor Mateo stepping away as Visitation Pastor, we were able to envision a new role that fits Sophia's many gifts and serves the growing needs of our congregation. Our lay visitation ministers and I will continue and grow our visitation ministry.

1) Finances continue to look healthy, thanks to your generosity. Summer is often "slow" with members on vacation and fewer visitors, so your continuing stewardship is appreciated.

2) We continue to monitor COVID, and in response to the new varient which seems to be more resistant to the vaccines and more apt to hit even those who have previously had COVID, we are upping our mask guidance from "encouraging to wear" to "STRONGLY encouraging to wear." We will maintain our distancing by blocking every other pew.

3) In line with the COVID monitoring, we have postponed the brunch we were all anticipating from our original July date to Aug. 21.

A church of our size and age has many areas that need updating, and those expenses often are not covered by our yearly budget. Thank you to our donor who recognized this need and stepped forward.

6) We are excited to announce a new staff position of Minister of Community Engagement. This position was visualized by Pastor following the resignation of Pastor Mateo as visiting pastor and the objectives of the congregation. 7) And finally, the congregation conversations time was postponed from July 17th to July 31st. Although the brunch part, as noted in #3 is postponed until August, the small group conversations are scheduled for July 31st following worship.
