Grace to you and peace from God, who is and who was, and who is to come (Revelation 1:4).

This greeting and beautiful imagery of God from the beginning of Revelation feels just right for our life together at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church. While we as a congregation spend important time learning our history, recognizing our present, and imagining our future, it is good that we remind one another regularly that we gather in the name of God who is past, present, and future.

This month marks the beginning of the season of Advent and the new Church Year. During Advent, we'll explore themes of hope, preparation, joy, and wonder. Hear anew the old stories of unexpected life changes, cosmic experiences, vulnerability, and welcome. One theme of Advent that can feel surprising (or even off-putting) is the churchy word "repentance." To our ears, this can bring up past experiences of being told we were wrong, bad, or even worse - unforgivable. One of my mentors (the Rev. Dr. Troy Troftgruben from Wartburg Seminary), likes to use the image of a phone or car navigation system to understand "repentance" in a new way. Rather than being a judgement without hope, the call to repent is a call to turn in a new direction, like a recalculated new route. Jesus Christ is this new Way - the way of mercy, justice, love, and hope for all people. During this season of turning, we are called anew to recalculate our route and follow Christ's path.

A heart-filled thank you for the welcome you've given to David, Cholla, and me. We are very grateful for the bountiful gifts of food, household items, gift cards, messages, and prayers that greeted us upon arrival. We're getting nicely settled in and already feel at home. And we are all very cozy with our beautiful new quilts! You've all stepped up wonderfully to serve during worship, throughout the week, and to help me become acquainted with the ministry and programs of Our Saviour's. My installation on November 14 was an extraordinary day thanks to the presence, effort, and care of our congregation, synod colleagues, family and friends.

This time of year can be one of joy, of sharing and giving, and being with loved ones. For some, it can be a time of grief as death or broken relationships or memories of the past feel especially painful. Remember to keep perspective during these days of Advent. When our culture pulls your focus too much towards excessive buying and planning, take time to pause, look around, recalculate your route, and go with mercy, justice, love, and hope for yourself and for all people.


