



A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. (Isaiah 11:1)

Suddenly, it seems, Advent is upon us. The season of Advent is often associated with expectation, anticipation, and waiting. This year, as we move from the last year in the Gospel of Luke to a year dwelling in the Gospel of Matthew, the focus is more on action than waiting. "Get ready!" God's word declares – the time has come. The passage above from Isaiah, which we'll

read in the second week of Advent shows the growth and movement of our lives, the earth, and our faith. A shoot emerges, a branch grows – we can expect fruits and blossoms to follow.

Lately, I have been noticing the contrast between movement and rest. Last month, I was invited to join Lutheran Campus Ministry for one of their Wednesday evening gatherings. After dinner, I led them in the practice of "Nap Chapel," a brief and worshipful experience that involves just what it sounds like – napping! I created this practice on internship at Luther College when I was in seminary. Getting the rest we need allows us to wake up to be fully present in our lives and in the world around us. During these weeks of Advent, and the pull of the world to fill our days with the busyness (and "business") of Christmas, may you find rest, restoration, and peace. May that found space bring you to deeper awareness of the Spirit's movement within and around you. May you be alert and awake to God's promise of new life and hope in Christ Jesus.
