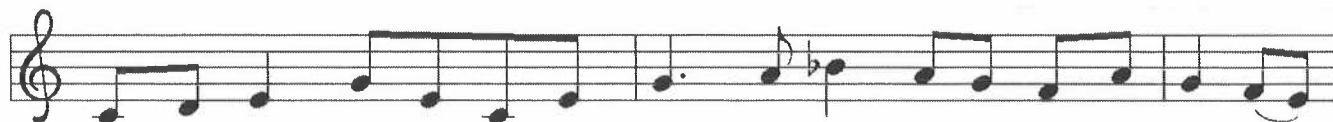

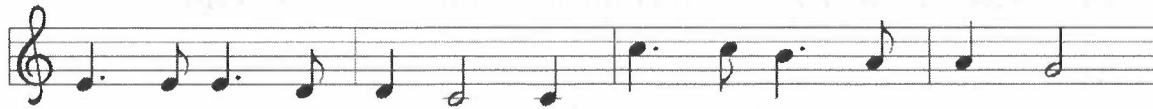

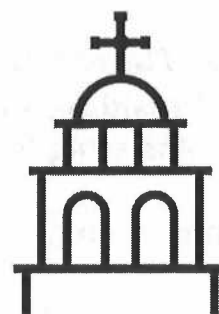

Summer Worship Themes

This summer we will be exploring several themes with our weekly readings. We will explore themes of the promise of abundant life given through the Gospel of John. You will notice some of the language and music in worship reflecting Jesus as the Bread of Life. This includes some creative Thanksgiving at the Table language written by the Rev. Dr. Karoline Lewis (Luther Seminary), which places the communion meal where it occurs in John - in the midst of Jesus' ministry, not at the end. Second, you may note that we are using what's called the "semicontinuous reading" with selections from First Samuel as our first reading for the summer. These passages explore themes of power and structure in early Israelite history.
