One of the questions that is likely on all of minds these days is "When may we begin worshiping together in person again?" The answer to that question is much more complex than naming one specific date. A special committee will be tasked with creating plans and protocols for safely and sensibly resuming gatherings of all kinds at OSLC. The committee will need to prioritize the congregation's health and safety while considering all of the diverse activities that take place at OSLC: worship services (our own as well as those of the congregations who share our space), our various groups and committees, L.S.S. activities, and more. Even if worship and some other in-person activities at OSLC are able to safely resume sooner rather than later, though, worship services will continue to be made available online at least through the end of July for those who still feel most comfortable worshiping from home. In the meantime, our congregation keeps finding creative ways to connect with each other and continue God's work. A committee has been calling to check on the wellbeing of all of our members, and to verify that we have correct contact information for everyone. And the Zoom Coffee Hours have been a fun way for members to "see" and visit with each other on Sundays; if you haven't joined us yet, consider connecting this week. Good things are happening around our campus, too: renovations to our nursery are well underway, and new security cameras have been installed. Our preparations for calling a new permanent pastor are still ongoing. Plans for hiring a new youth leader position remain on hold, though. Given that the global circumstances have shifted our original hiring timeline (and we're now heading into a summer when few youth activities may take place), it now seems more practical to prioritize the search for a new pastor; our new pastor, in turn, can then take part in the search for a new youth leader.

Our overall finances remain healthy at this time, although we have seen a small dip in our weekly offerings. Thank you for you faithful support even while we are worshiping from home, and please remember to either mail your offerings to the church office or arrange for automatic online giving; both of these methods help ensure that all of your offerings go directly to the church

(without any bank fees).

It is a comfort and a joy to remember that God is always good, and always with us. Please join us in caring for each other and in praying for our church and community.

Refugee Sewing Program

Just like everything else that happens at the church, the weekly gathering of the Women's Empowerment Program that teaches refugee ladies to sew has had to stop meeting. But that hasn't prevented the ladies (and at least one husband) from sewing at home, using the skills they have learned to create masks for health care workers. The LSS program is completely coordinated and run by volunteers who, partnered with Imago Dei Middle School, have been able to obtain the elastic needed and prepare kits for the sewers to pick up Monday mornings in the church parking



lot and return the completed masks the following week. Our Saviour's quilters have been able to help by contributing many yards of wonderful 100% cotton fabric from our "stash" which the volunteers cut and then package into 40 or 50 mask bundles. The refugee stitchers receive cash for every mask they make which has really helped their families as well as giving the ladies a wonderful way of giving back to the community. It is quite a sight to see the cars that line up in the parking lot on Monday mornings around 0:20 to make the exchanges, safely of course, of kits Monday mornings around 9:30 to make the exchanges, safely of course, of kits and masks. Even the teaching was done while everyone stayed in their cars!!
