

The Triduum or The Three Days are the most sacred days of the church year. We enter these three days on Maundy Thursday, recalling the new commandment to love one another. We receive individual absolution. Worship concludes with the Stripping of the altar as a reminder of the fleeing disciples who left everything behind and Jesus, too! The bare chancel is now set for Good Friday.

On Good Friday we hear John's account of Jesus death and burial. We hear the judgement of crucifixion and his being led to fulfill the mission that he was set to accomplish, namely, "for God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son." He dies with the words, "It is finished" – Mission Accomplished. We pray this day for the all believers and those who do not believe. We conclude worship remembering and honoring that Holy Cross on which was hung the salvation of the whole world.

On Holy Saturday we gather around a new fire that reminds us of the purification that comes through the new birth in the resurrection of Christ. We process with lighted candles. We hear the ancient stories of creation and salvation for God's people, Israel. We are pointed to the message of the resurrected Jesus and we celebrate the first Great Thanksgiving of Easter having renewed the faith of our baptism.

It is important to note that the Three Days is one continuous worship service held over the three days of Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The benediction and final blessing come at the end of the Easter Vigil. Thursday ends in darkness; Friday begins and ends in darkness; Saturday begins in the darkness of the tomb and ends with the bright light of the resurrection.



We're pleased to report that OSLC's financial picture remains strong. For the second year in a row we'll be operating from a balanced budget, and we'll be paying the remaining balance on our last property mortgage early through funds received via an anonymous bequest at the end of 2020. Not only will paying the mortgage early save the congregation's general fund approximately \$75,000 in interest, but OSLC will be debt-free for the first time in many years. Thank you for your ongoing generosity, especially during these challenging times. If you have not yet made your pledge for 2021 you may still do so, either through the link on our website or via mail.

The Transition and process for calling a new Senior Pastor to OSLC is moving ahead as planned. Complete the congregational biography otherwise known and the Ministry Site Profile. (April – May)


In May we will assemble the Call Committee and have a review of the Ministry Site Profile with the Transition Team and the Congregational Council.

The Call Committee will then work with the Synod Staff to review and interview prospective candidates. After interviews the Call Committee will seek to make a unanimous recommendation to the Council. The Council will vote and if in the affirmative the candidate will be forwarded to the congregation to vote by at least a 2/3rds vote to extend the call to the candidate who has up to 30 days to decide to accept or decline the call. When the call is accepted the transition to the new pastor leader will lead to his or her installation.

So, we are moving deliberatively but not hastily forward in our discernment as God calls us into the future and leads us in calling the next pastoral leader.
