Christ's ministry has continued during this season of transition thanks to your work to provide care to one another and the community. I give special thanks to Pastor Martha for her pastoral shepherding of Our Saviour's and her warm welcome to me, and to the Congregational Council, Call Committee, staff and volunteer ministers for your faithful leadership.

I look forward to meeting you in worship, in your home, at your school or office, or any of the many places where our paths will begin to cross in the coming weeks and months. One of the earliest church builders, Paul, instructed the people of Corinth, "Let all that you do be done in love." (1 Corinthian 14:16). This is a good place to start as Christ points us to a life and community grounded in love for God, one another, and the creation around us. Let's move forward together in this love.

Dear Members of the OSLC Community—

It was good to see so many of you at the October 24 gathering, held in appreciation of Pastor Martha and the many others whose dedication and hard work helped our congregation through both our pastoral transition and the pandemic. We hope you'll all join us in thanking Pastor Martha and wishing her well.

Of course the biggest news this month is that we will be welcoming Pastor Amalia Vagts as our new Senior Pastor on November 1. The parsonage has been prepared for her and her family, and the congregation is invited to attend her Installation on November 14 (see below for more details).

We're also pleased to share the good news that we are in conversation with Pastor Rebecca Boardman about relocating the hub of the University of Arizona's Lutheran Campus Ministries to Our Saviour's. We know that many in the congregation have long hoped to strengthen the relationship between OSLC and Lutheran Campus Ministries, and we hope that you will share our excitement about this partnership.

This month we hired a security patrol to monitor the OSLC campus during overnight hours, and this step seems to have been effective in helping to address some of recent security concerns. Please continue to care for each other, though, especially while on campus during evening hours. And while security measures help create a safe and clean environment around OSLC, they do not address the underlying needs of the homeless community; please prayerfully consider ministry opportunities inherent in this situation.

We continue to monitor local Covid-19 conditions and OSLC's finances closely. Because local Covid-19 conditions have not changed significantly since last month, please continue to practice social distancing and wear masks (regardless of vaccination status). Meanwhile, offerings remain under budget for 2021, as do our expenses; thank you for your continued generosity.

We give thanks for all of the ways, large and small, that the Lord continues to bless our congregation.
