





Recently in worship, we heard the story of an unnamed rich person and a poor beggar named Lazarus. While their lives were starkly different, they intersected at this point in the story:

"The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried." (Luke 16:22)

During the month of October, we will explore topics related to living and dying well.

These are not conversations only for those who are older, or who feel closer to the end of their lives. All ages can benefit from honest and open-hearted conversation about how we live and how we prepare for death. We will explore these topics during Sunday Workshop – a new community time from 8:30 - 9:30 on Sunday mornings.

We will begin on **October 2 when we celebrate the growth of our living congregation** and welcome newcomers to the community. We will be welcoming about a dozen people who wish to join our community of faith. Typically, this kind of welcome occurs in the context of worship. We'll be bringing this part of "worship" into our Workshop time. We will gather on the patio for coffee and treats from 8:30 – 9:30. There will be a brief welcome service around 9:00 am.

On October 9<sup>th</sup>, we will gather in the Activity Building to share in conversation about generosity and giving. We'll have small group conversations, led by me and members of the Generosity Team. Coffee and treats in AB Café.

We will welcome **Karen McDonald from Interfaith Community Services on October 16**<sup>th</sup> to lead a discussion about Advanced Care Directives. Do you have one? Do you know where it is? Do you know what it is? Do your parents have one? These are important conversations to have with your loved ones. This is a two-part workshop – we'll continue with part two in November. Coffee and treats in AB Café.

On October 23, you'll have the chance to start thinking and planning your own funeral. I will lead this workshop and I promise to keep it lively and engaging as you are invited to think about the songs, readings, and rituals that are important to you. Coffee and treats in AB Café.

At the end of the month, on October 30<sup>th</sup>, our young people, led by Sophia Rankin, will lead a worship about the Mexican tradition of *ofrenda* ("offering") and home altars. We will be creating a memory altar together in the Chapel. Members are encouraged to bring photos and small items to honor your loved ones who have died.

I hope you will join as we examine our lives and our deaths together, resting in the promise of God who is everlasting, who is present in all.

Hello siblings in Christ!

Your council had another productive meeting on September 20, 2022. We would like to share some highlights with you.

Our financial picture remains strong, thanks to your faithfulness.

Committees are working incredibly hard. Stewardship for All Seasons will be sharing their visions with you with their kickoff on October 16th. Please look for their information. Property Committee has been scouting around our campus for areas that need to be updated and/or brought up to snuff in repair. Our campus custodian, John, is undertaking many of these projects and has been repairing stucco, painting etc. The roof repairs on both the sanctuary and office/annex/chapel have been completed. In mid-October, the north parking lot will be resurfaced. At their suggestion, the council voted to sell our two vans which do not meet our church needs at this time and are costing us substantially in upkeep. We anticipate purchasing a smaller van type vehicle in the future that be useful for picking up parishioners and transporting smaller cargo. If anyone in the congregation has expertise in vehicle selling/ buying or knows of someone who could help, please contact the office/pastor and volunteer to help with this!!!

We continue to monitor the Covid and flu situation and will modify as necessary with the safety of all of you our primary focus.

Do you know the outreach your church supports in our community and beyond? We received letters thanking us for our support from the Grand Canyon Synod; from our Navajo Lutheran Mission in Rock Point, Arizona; and from local

Agencies: Youth on their Own, Our Family Services, and Interfaith Community Services. And that was just from this last month!
