Dear Members of OSLC Community—

We're pleased to once again report that our finances remain stable; our offering income is still a bit lower than what we budgeted, but our expenses have also been lower than expected. We're mindful, though, that we do still have some staff positions to fill, so we anticipate that our

monthly operating expenses will rise in the near future when we're fully staffed again. We're grateful for your faithful and generous giving, and ask that you prayerfully consider how you can continue to support OSLC and our ministries.

Although we've been blessed with an abundance of desert rain this summer, the rain did cause some damage around OSLC; you may see some repairs happening around our campus during the coming weeks. We also have some exciting property-related news to share: even though Lutheran Social Services-SW has now moved to their new location, we will continue to serve as a partner in their Refugee Resettlement ministry. OSLC's rental properties will be among the properties LSS-SW considers when seeking homes for refugee families. Please see https://www.lss-sw.org/refugee-housing for more information about this important ministry.

We continue to monitor the latest information about Covid-19 and its impact in our community. Based on current CDC guidelines and the role that vaccines now play in helping to protect us from the virus, we believe we can retire our earlier policy which would require us to return to online services if the positivity rate in our community rose above 5% for two consecutive weeks. Given that case numbers are steadily rising in Pima County, though, masks will once again be required during worship and other indoor gatherings, and we ask for your help with social distancing and frequent hand washing in order to help care for each other's safety and wellbeing.

It has come to our attention that we're in need of volunteers in the office, for worship (lectors, communion assistants, etc.), and on several committees. If you were a volunteer prior to Covid-19 and would like to continue serving, or if you would like to volunteer in new ways, please let Pastor Martha, a Council Member, or the church office know.

We hope you'll continue to join us in praying for our church and our community.
