When I think about our life together as a community of faith, a grounding text comes from Ephesians: "The gifts Christ gave were...to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ..." (4:11-12).

Many in the congregation have been wondering when things will "return" to normal. Familiar patterns have changed during this time of Covid and pastoral transition. Rather than thinking about "returning," I encourage us to *rediscover* ways to **equip one another for the work of ministry, to build up the body of Christ**.

Over the past few months, I've been in conversation with the congregation, the Council, ministry partners, and God about our next steps, especially related to our Sunday morning worship and learning time. I have heard a hope to offer an early Chapel service again, a desire to hold learning and fellowship at a time that allows for us to all be together, and an openness to adjusting our schedule to offer a later service. With these things in mind, I propose we try this schedule as an experiment October – May.

#### **Proposed Schedule:**

7:30 Chapel Worship

8:30 Sunday *Workship* – learning, service, and fellowship

9:45 Sanctuary Worship (and livestream)

**Sunday Worship** will continue to contain a mix of music and worship styles with Lutheran liturgy, songs and readings, a sermon, and communion. The 9:45 time may appeal to families and college students and 7:30 will work for those early to rise. Because our gathering time will be between services, we'll all get a chance to connect with one another. And everything will still end around 11 am in case you like to go out for brunch!

**Sunday** *Workship* is a "workshop" where we put our faith into action. Each week we will offer ways to connect with our faith: speakers, projects, breakfast, music, faith formation, discussion groups, games, and more. I'm excited to create this with your help and ideas. I'll be building a core team to help lead this – so if this idea energizes you, please reach out.

I know that not everyone welcomes change. However, I am hopeful that as a community we can try this on and see how it suits us. We will launch in October. In June, we plan to return to one service and evaluate how it went. I invite you to explore with me how the Spirit is moving at Our Saviour's. Together, we trust God and engage with one another as we equip each other for ministry and build up the body of Christ.

While many have had a chance to weigh in, this may be news for some. Please reach out to me for conversation if you have questions.



The Food Bank Peanut Butter party in July was an overwhelming success. Faith Communities stepped up and donated 13,674 jars of peanut butter, more than the



goal of 10,000. That will keep the shelves stocked for at least 5 months. In July our Congregation donated 384 pounds of food and hygiene products including 83 jars of peanut butter.

Donations are down and demand has increased over 50% from this time last year so please continue giving generously. The Food Bank accepts in-date, canned and packaged non-perishable items including pasta, peanut butter, canned meats, rice, beans, cereal and personal hygiene items. Please put donations in the shopping cart that is on the patio on Sundays.

ICS offers emergency assistance with rent and utilities. The new Mobile Bank went into service earlier this year and stops at several locations around Tucson. For further information call the Office at (520) 297-6049 Monday-Friday, 8am to 4pm.
