Jesus welcomes you as you are to the table. Become what you receive.







PALM SUNDAY - Sunday April 13

In the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, those welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem, laid their cloaks on the ground and cut leafy branches from nearby trees and fields. The people lay down their cloaks in Luke's Gospel and in the Gospel of John, they gather palm branches and shout, "Hosanna!" which means "Save us!"

This Palm Sunday, we encourage you to bring either something green and leafy from your yard or a gently worn clothing item that can be donated following our service. We will gather in the Courtyard at the beginning of worship and process together into the Sanctuary.


