HIDDEN GEMS

Back in the days of sharper eyes and flexier knees, I used to hunt for beach agates. There were certain disciplines that helped. A slow plod made for the best pace. Eyes angled slightly forward to catch glistenings of mineral illuminated by a coastal sky. A modest light from the overcast was best, much preferred over a sunny blinding glare or the curtaining of Pacific Northwest soaking rains. Once a candidate was spotted, the knees took over to provide a closer look that would confirm the find. Or not. In any case: time must be taken, attention must be paid.

I have long since lost the mimeographed sheet from my first year at seminary that laid out a process for digging into a Biblical text. As I remember, the pattern followed that of hunting for agates. Time must be taken – to search words in search of Word. Attention must be paid – not just to the obvious and familiar, but to the things and ones hidden in plain sight. Things and ones that might be revealing of the Big Picture. Hidden gems.

All of which is to introduce a trial run of this digital companion for worship preparation. For the next 8 weeks, I will root around in the coming Sunday's texts for some hidden gem. Perhaps a word easily overlooked but telling. Perhaps meanings or patterns or parallels clearer in the original languages than their English renderings. Perhaps some aspect of context or rhetoric that sheds light on the whole. Or perhaps? Your opinions will be welcomed by Pastor Amalia and me as to whether this is a useful guide to continue... or to give it a proper burial.

There will be a link to Hidden Gems in the weekly e-mailings. I will seek to keep each one close to the length of this introduction. Not because more could not be said – but in hopes that more of your time and attention will be spent in your own further exploring.

Council discussed this later in the meeting under new business and voted to whole heartedly support the effort with a grant from the Ministry Growth Fund interest. More information will be coming out to the Congregation about this worthy endeavor.

Jennifer Strand reported that she had been reviewing annual reports going back to 1945 as part of the prep for the 80th Anniversary Celebration. Many great ideas are surfacing for the event. It is envisioned that there will be a series of skits highlighting different aspects of OSLC over the years. The committee continues to look for volunteers to work on writing guides. They will also need actors for the skits. If you have every felt you were destined for Broadway, this could be your big chance to launch that career.

Youth On Their Own

As the school year gets going, more unaccompanied youth (those without a parent, guardian, or stable home) will be identified by the schools and subsequently referred to YOTO. Current YOTO clients will also be returning to school. What does YOTO do to help them? There are three components that YOTO addresses. 1. Financial assistance is provided to each student in the form of a monthly stipend as long as the student is attending school. 2. Basic human needs are addressed include food, hygiene and household supplies (LIKE THOSE YOU HAVE DONATED - THANK YOU!!), and transportation via bicycles and SunTran passes should they stop being free to riders. 3.) Guidance is provided in collaboration with other local agencies in the form of housing referrals, personal counseling, one-on-one success coaching, medical, dental & vision care, and employment and community involvement opportunities.

In a nutshell, YOTO helps at-risk students become successful, productive adults. The Back-To-School Challenge is still in progress, so feel free to bring in school supplies to church and place them in the YOTO bin. Thank you!

God Be With You Til We Meet Again

With gratitude, good wishes, and some sadness the congregation said thank you and farewell to Rev. Glenn Schrader and Ted Adams on Sunday, August 17. Pastor Glenn and Ted shared with the congregation in mid-July that they were relocating to Colorado.

Pastor Glenn was called as Associate Pastor for Faith Formation at Our Saviour's in October of 2023. In the 20 years prior to ordination and during his years as a professor and dean at University of Arizona, Pastor Glenn was an active member of Our Saviour's. His partner Ted Adams was a regular attender for those years as well, becoming a member in June of 2022. As a lay leader, Pastor Glenn led numerous education and faith formation opportunities over the years, providing key leadership for the Sunday Forum, which sometimes filled the Activity Building and included guest presenters for the University of Arizona, Wartburg Theological Seminary, and other parts of the country. Pastor Glenn was a key leader in the Diakonia program, and a graduate of the program before beginning seminary at Wartburg. Pastor Glenn served in leadership roles around the Synod as well. During his call as Associate Pastor, he revived the Sunday Forum, launched a new pastor-led Bible Study called "Come & See," helped launch and lead the Reconciling in Christ process, the Scattering Group, and provided regular preaching and worship leading at Our Saviour's. His passion for faith formation and leadership development will leave a lasting legacy at Our Saviour's. Also an avid desert gardener, Pastor Glenn could often be found around the Our Saviour's campus, planting or tending to many desert plans he brought from his and Ted's home. After officially joining the congregation in 2022, Ted Adams was quickly enlisted to serve in a range of ways with the congregation, bringing his skills of financial expertise, attention to detail, and care for the congregation. Ted served on Council, including as Secretary of the congregation beginning in 2022. He served in worship in a range of roles (assisting minister, acolyte, usher, greeter), on the Endowment Committee and Finance Committee. Ted could often be found helping out in the kitchen before and after events. In addition to their generous service with the congregation, Ted and Pastor Glenn were involved with a number of local organizations, notably TIHAN and Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest. Additionally, their public and long-time presence as a couple paved the way for our Reconciling in Christ decision in 2025.

On August 17th, we blessed and sent these two faithful leaders, with grateful hearts and quilts from the Our Saviour's quilting ministry to keep them warm during the Denver winter. We also put together a few of the many wonderful photos taken by Jack Wahl. The banner that Pastor Glenn and Ted made for Pastor Glenn's ordination was given to the congregation as a continued sign of their ministry and work to join in God's reconciling love.

We give thanks for the many years of ministry and care from Pastor Glenn and Ted - as you have been a blessing to us, may you be carried by God to be a blessing in your new community in Colorado.

As Pastor Glenn liked to say at the beginning of worship: This is the day that the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it!
