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OVERVIEW OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE:

The readings for Transfiguration Sunday take us to mountains and holy encounters. Exodus tells of Moses' second ascent up Mount Sinai to enter the cloud of God's presence. The psalmist praises the king enthroned on Mount Zion as God's own. The author of 2 Peter writes of witnessing the transfiguration of Jesus. The previous passage in Matthew had Jesus teaching the cost of discipleship. Matthew now tells the story of Jesus' mountaintop transfiguration. Those who are its witnesses are given a command for what to do next. "Listen to Jesus."



Today's Presiding Minister: John Indermark
John Indermark is a retired pastor and writer. He was ordained to ministry in the United Church of Christ on June 4, 1976. John served as pastor of three parishes from 1976 until 1992. Over the next 25 years, he wrote devotional books and Christian Education materials for adults. During that time, he also did supply preaching and served one interim pastoral position in Methodist, Presbyterian, and Lutheran congregations in southwest Washington and northwest Oregon. The ELCA and the UCC are full communion partners, and with Pastor Amalia's invitation, John is able to preside at communion and preach at Our Saviour's. John and Judy Indermark became members of Our Saviour's on Pentecost Sunday in 2024.

***PRAYER OF THE DAY**

FIRST READING

Our Old Testament reading is from the book of Exodus.

On their escape from Egypt through the wilderness, the tribes of Israel arrive at Mount Sinai. Chapter 19 had begun the story of Moses ascending the mountain. The next three chapters told of God revealing there the Ten Commandments and other parts of God's covenant. Our reading takes place when Moses ascends Sinai for a second time and enters the cloud of God's presence.

Exodus 24:12-18

¹² The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and wait there; I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction."

¹³ So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up onto the mountain of God. ¹⁴ To the elders he had said, "Wait here for us, until we come back to you. Look, Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them."

¹⁵ Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. ¹⁶ The glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. ¹⁷ Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the Israelites. ¹⁸ Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

PSALM 2:1-7

- ¹ Why are the nations in an uproar?

SECOND READING

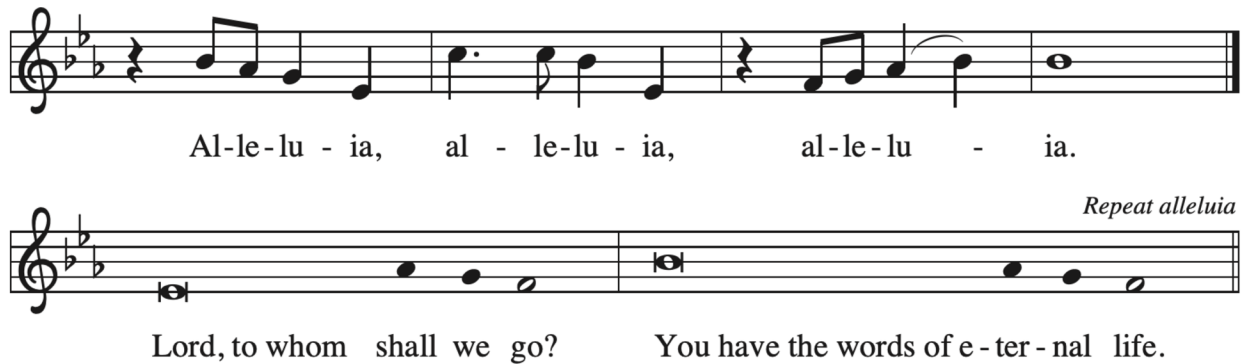
Our New Testament reading is from Second Peter.

Much of this second letter credited to Peter takes on church divisions. That situation is seen in passages about false teachers and prophets. In our reading, the author provides a first-person account of the transfiguration of Jesus. The purpose is not just a description of that event. It also bolsters the writer's authority to take on those who divide and confuse the church.

2 Peter 1:16 -21

- ¹⁶ We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.
- ¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, ²¹ because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

¹ Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. ² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became bright as light. ³ Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. ⁴ Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will set up three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." ⁵ While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" ⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. ⁷ But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." ⁸ And when they raised their eyes, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."
