

## **OVERVIEW OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE:**

The readings for this first Sunday in Lent contrast the reality of human sin with the power of God's forgiveness and grace. Genesis tells the Garden story of "The Fall," when temptation leads to disobedience. Even then, God shows care and grace by story's end (3:21). The psalm urges confession, not denial, of sin as the path to forgiveness and healing. Paul contrasts the mark of sin upon all by the act of one with the seal of grace offered to all through Christ. Matthew tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Unlike the Garden, temptations are rejected.



## \*PRAYER OF THE DAY

### FIRST READING

*Our Old Testament reading is from the book of Genesis.*

*This story of “The Fall” is familiar. Adam and Eve, a serpent, a tree, a fruit. It is a story simple in its tale of “what went wrong.” It is also a story whose intricacy evokes wonder. If God did not wish the fruit of this tree to be eaten: why place the tree in the garden? This may be heard as an origin story of human free will. This may be heard as a story where the seed of grace is planted already at the Bible’s and life’s “in the beginning.” In Genesis 3:21, God does not carry out the warning of “the day you eat this you will die.” Instead, God makes clothing for Adam and Eve.*

### Genesis 2:15-17; 3:1-7

<sup>15</sup> The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. <sup>16</sup> And the Lord God commanded the man, “You may freely eat of every tree of the garden, <sup>17</sup> but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.”

<sup>3:1</sup> Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the Lord God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God say, ‘You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?’” <sup>2</sup> The woman said to the serpent, “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, <sup>3</sup> but God said, ‘You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.’” <sup>4</sup> But the serpent said to the woman, “You will not die, <sup>5</sup> for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil.” <sup>6</sup> So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food and that it was a delight to the eyes and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. <sup>7</sup> Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked, and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

## SECOND READING

*Our New Testament reading is from Paul's letter to the church at Rome.*

*Today's reading is like entering the middle of a complex conversation. Earlier in Romans, Paul set the stage for what he writes here about sin and grace. Chapter 3 in particular reveals that the power of sin in today's opening verses is already restricted. The reason? "The righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe." Paul now reaches into his mooring in the Hebrew Scriptures to contrast Adam and Jesus in order to assert the primacy of grace.*

## RIC Forum - March 29, 10:30 AM

The Reconciling in Christ team will lead several forums this spring on the topic of "Expansive Welcome." On March 29th (Palm Sunday), the congregation is invited to watch and discuss A Time for Burning. This 55-minute film by Bill Jersey was commissioned by the national Lutheran Church and documents Pastor Bill Youngdahl's unsuccessful efforts to drive reform by arranging visitations between his parish, the Omaha Augustana Lutheran Church, and Calvin Memorial and Hope Lutheran, two nearby black churches, in 1966. The film aired nationally on public television and was nominated for the Best Documentary Picture Academy Award in 1967. It is a raw, honest, and still relevant conversation about racism, church communities, and social change.
